New Appointment System for American Citizen Services

The American Citizen Services (ACS) Unit of the U.S. Consulate General in St. Petersburg has introduced an Appointment System for all services, including passport renewals (and passport extra pages), Consular Reports of Birth Abroad, notarial services, and general inquiries. **Please make your appointment before you visit the Consular Section.** Appointments are available immediately; beginning October 15, 2009. Appointments may be made at any time via the link below. Appointments are available Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday afternoons, and Wednesday mornings. The American Citizen Services Unit of the Consulate General of the United States in St. Petersburg, Russia, provides a broad range of statutorily-mandated services to American citizens residing in or visiting Russia. These services include routine passport, citizenship, notarial, Federal Benefits, and voting assistance functions. Appointments are required for all services; you can make an appointment online at http://stpetersburg.usconsulate.gov/visit.html. We also provide emergency services in the event of death, arrest, destitution, and illness of individual American citizens, and disaster situations effecting large numbers of Americans. For more information about these services, please visit our website at http://stpetersburg.usconsulate.gov, which has information for Americans living in or visiting Russia under the topic heading Citizen Services.

The Department of State recommends American travelers review the Russia information sheet at http://travel.state.gov/, our comprehensive information for travelers. Please pay particular attention to the section on entry/exit requirements, as this is what causes travelers to Russia the most problems. Travelers may also consult the website of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), http://www.cdc.gov, which provides country-specific health information.

We strongly recommend that Americans who travel to or reside in Russia visit http://travel.state.gov/travel/abroad_registration.html, to register your contact information on-line with the Consulate. By doing this, you will receive any emergency information sent by the Consulate. (Please note that registering with the Consulate is voluntary. The Russian government requires that all visitors register their visas with local authorities. Registering with the Consulate does NOT satisfy this requirement.)
