

CAMP PARKS POLICE CONDUCTS RANGE FIRE!

As part of an annual training requirement to qualify of the issued firearms the Camp Parks Police Department conducted a range shoot on July 18-19 at the Livermore Rod and Gun Club.

All the police and security officers participated in a two day event that required them to qualify with their issued 9mm firearm. They also shot M16 Rifles to stay proficient.

The start of the range began with a classroom portion where Office C. Watson conducted a safety and operation brief. Watson ensured everyone understood the safety requirements of the range.

On the range Sergeant E. Branscome , who was the Range Master for the Police Department guided the officers through the qualification course of fire. The officers fired the Military Police Qualification Course that required distances of 35, 25, 15, and 7 meters. At the end of the two day event all the officers qualified.
