### **Supervision Responsibilities**

Supervision responsibilities involve abiding by the conditions of your release as granted by the Superior Court of the District of Columbia and/or the United States Parole Commission. General conditions are imposed to provide basic rules and guidelines that must be adhered to while on supervision. In addition, special conditions may be imposed to address other needs and requirements to be completed while on supervision. These conditions will remain in effect for the entire period of probation, parole, or supervised release.
