## Supervision Responsibilities

Supervision responsibilities involve abiding by the conditions of your release as granted by the Superior Court of the District of Columbia and/or the United States Parole Commission. General conditions are imposed to provide basic rules and guidelines that must be adhered to while on supervision. In addition, special conditions may be imposed to address other needs and requirements to be completed while on supervision. These conditions will remain in effect for the entire period of probation, parole, or supervised release.

### Common General Conditions:

- Report to Office Visits
- Drug Testing
- Maintain Contact with CSO
- Obey All Laws
- Obtain/Maintain Employment
- Permit CSO to verify residence
- Notify CSO within 24 hours of change of residence
- Obtain permission to travel/relocate

### Common Special Conditions:

- Stay Away Order
- Fines/VVCC payments
- Drug Treatment
- Counseling
- Education
- Community Service
