Key Annual Programs



One of our community outreach programs, Missoula Children's

Theatre (MCT) provides the development of life skills in children through participation in the performing arts and group dynamics while excelling as an individual - a lesson from art that carries into life. We also provide the opportunity for two MCT directors to go into local schools and give acting workshops during the week of the performance.



Camp Adventure is a summer day camp held in June, July and August designed for children ages 5-12 years. With activity planning built around the four core areas, the program provides a safe, fun filled, memorable time for your children. Swimming, bowling, skating,

special guest speakers, and a variety of field trips round out our summer camp offerings. Full day camp hours are 7:15 am - 4:30 pm Monday through Friday. Parents can choose which week(s) of camp their children will attend. There is no requirement to register for the entire summer. Rates are based upon total household income.

Annual Fishing Derby is held every summer for ages 5-12. This free event introduces the sport of fishing and the chance for children to spin their own yarn about the ones that got away.



Easter Egg Hunt is held the Saturday before Easter for ages 2-12 divided into three groups with prizes in each. The Easter Bunny comes to visit with the kids.

Affiliations

The Boys & Girls Clubs of America promote positive youth BOYS & GIRLS development through the provision of opportunities for young people to develop the skills they will need to become successful and contributing members of our communities. These are offered in programs that fall under the four service areas of Sports and Fitness/Health, Arts, Leisure & Recreation, Life Skills, Citizenship & Leadership, and Academic Support, Mentoring and Intervention.

As an affiliate 4-H Club, we provide organized, structured learning opportunities through research based, hands-on educational experiences.



Youth Employment Skills (YES) Program is an on-base youth volunteer program funded by the Air Force Aid Society (AFAS) and

implemented by the Arnold Youth Center. High school age dependents of Active Duty Air Force members have an opportunity to learn valuable work skills while having a positive impact on their base communities. Program participation incentives are dollar credits for grant funding. The YES Program allows all certified and enrolled high school students to "bank" volunteer dollar credits toward their post-secondary education/training at a rate of \$4 per hour volunteered.

At minimal start-up cost to you, you can operate your own business, set your own hours, be with your children and care for other children at home.
