# **Understanding Space Weather**

## **Controlling The 'High Ground' Extends From 'The Mud To The Sun'**

This past November, I briefed all the Air Force four-star general officers at the CORONA conference held at the U.S. Air Force Academy, Colo.

The briefing was on the importance of weather, and how we are using all the nation's assets to meet military needs.

The briefing went well. During the talk, an interesting question came from one of the four-stars: "Tom, what is space weather?" While we have been successful in raising the atmospheric weather awareness in the Air Force, that is only half of the picture.

In the seamless battlespace of today's Air Force, operations don't stop at the tropopause, but extend beyond the geosynchronous satellite altitude.

Satellite telecommunications and sensors have expanded the medium of warfare from the mud and ocean surface through the environment of space. In addition, the space environment is not benign; it is a hostile, dangerous environment where we're required to conduct military operations.

As the Air Force and Army move forward with exploiting the weather, we must pay attention to all elements in the natural environment that impact operations, both in the troposphere and in space. We must provide an integrated look and a seamless environment.

As I have traveled around AFW, my perception is that only a small por-

tion of the weather community understands space weather as well as tropospheric weather. In the remainder of this column, I will address the need for expanded space weather awareness both in the AFW community, and in the Army and Air Force as a whole.

Throughout history, military advantage has rested with controlling the high ground. This doctrinal concept remains just as true — and possibly even more true -- today.

The difference between today's military operations and those of the Civil War period is that the high ground today is not Lookout Mountain, or Cemetery Ridge — the high ground today is space — as it was during

### **DESERT STORM.**

Control of the high ground includes understanding how to exploit space-based sensors and phenomenon to our advantage, and how to mitigate the effects of space weather on military and civil space and ground-based systems.

Did you know that a major geomagnetic storm in 1994 caused the United

States to lose one satellite completely, have significant permanent power loss in two or more additional satellites, and burned out portions of the North American electrical power grid? In addition, there were significant effects on "terrestrial" military capabilities as well. We lost high frequency (HF) and cross-polar communications for an extended period and satellite communications links were disrupted.

These effects from a major space weather storm cut across all aspects of military operations. We, the AFW community, are responsible for working with the other operators in the Air Force to ease the impact. That is where you come in.

We have a goal to develop the world's preeminent space weather capability — and to ensure we get the word out on our capabilities. As a start, Air Force Space Command Directorate of Weather has put together an introductory briefing to space weather. I have asked them to make it available to the entire weather community. We are increasing our space weather awareness in technical school. We are putting the focus on space weather to effectively integrate the area into Air Force operations.

Over the next several months, we will be putting out more information on space weather — but right now, I want every Air Force Weather person to recognize that the Weather in AFW goes from the mud to the sun — and then strive to help your customers exploit the seamless battlespace.

# Time For An Attitude Check!

## Disquieting Indicators On The Horizon

**H**appy New Year and welcome to what promises to be an exciting 1996 for Air Force Weather!

Looking back, we accomplished a great deal together in 1995. For starters, this *OBSERVER* marks the one-year anniversary of the new format and our second Almanac edition. Thanks for all the positive feedback.

Meteorological Process Reviews and Meteorological Enhancement Team Seminars were tremendously successful last year. We conducted about 70 sessions in 1995 at base and post weather stations worldwide and will keep up the pace this year.

Other successes include the Small Tactical Terminal program, AWDS 3.1 software, and the Manual Observing System (MOS).

We're also very proud of the successful transition of two space environmental support models. Two more will follow in 1996. They give the 50th Weather Squadron capabilities that exist nowhere else in the world.

Yet for all of the wonderful accomplishments in 1995, there are a few disquieting indicators on the horizon. For example, one commander called his biggest concern "seeing roughly 10 percent of weather folks truly enjoying the career field and 50 percent wanting out."

Do we have an AFW-wide problem or a local morale issue? Some years ago, exit interviews with separating airmen revealed disappointment with the discipline and esprit de corps found in military service. They expected much higher standards. This is a modern leadership challenge, too.

Here's another incongruity. Everywhere I go, people ask about rumored cuts in Air Force Institute of Technology opportunities.

Yet Capt. Tim Hutchison at the Air Force Personnel Center is having a devil of a time filling the slots we have now. Our folks certainly must understand the career and personal advantages of an advanced degree.

Where are the qualified volunteers? Are they waiting too long to seek AFIT eligibility? Speaking of volunteers, we have continuing difficulty finding qualified flight commanders.

Air Weather Service Vice Commander Col. Gerald Riley even tells me he often must go through "a complex mating dance" to match some Thor's Leaders officers with key assignments. Not a healthy sign, my friends.

There are technical concerns as well. They range from weather stations with forecast consistency problems, where significant differences occur between the TAF and advisories in effect and what is briefed to crews, to the apparent inability of Air Force weather units to achieve improved weather warning performance from the WSR-88D system comparable to National Weather Service counterparts.

Some units engage in a stampede to find new, nonstandard sources of weather information and devote precious little attention to the impact this will have on joint warfighting operations.

Many consider numerical models the final answer instead of just tools that must be used properly to be effective.

These concerns are worrisome, but I believe they can be fixed by communicating Air Force core values and working hard as a team to improve technical skills.

However, there is another issue that is disruptive to team building and cohesion. It deals with an inability within AFW to maintain consensus on the path we need to follow.

I strongly favor open and honest (but not endless) debate on key issues,



but once Air Force senior leaders make a decision, it's time to salute smartly and get the job done.

Some people still oppose the AFW STANEVAL function long after the Chief of Staff of the Air Force decided to start up the program. Some folks want a vote on how HQ AWS executes weather modernization and equipment replacement programs after approval and funding by Congress.

I appreciate the desire to help, but command by committee?

We go to great lengths to involve MAJCOM representatives in the formative stages of programs, and expect they communicate with their staff principals and are empowered to represent MAJCOM viewpoints. Sometimes I wonder. Recently an overseas MAJCOM action officer criticized us for "all this focus on warfighters." "Don't you guys know the Cold War is over?" Maybe he wanted to test my blood pressure.

While the concerns mentioned above don't necessarily represent the overall healthy state of AFW, I do believe it is time for some careful introspection.

The CSAF was very clear that empowerment will never replace leadership or unity of effort as core Air Force values.

Retired Air Force Gen. Duane Cassidy said it very well in 1986: "We're operating as a team, no matter what uniform we wear. We all realize we're in the same boat, where no one can say, 'Your half of the boat is on fire.'"

So, welcome to 1996. Let's "grab an oar," roll up our sleeves, and get on with the serious business of being the world's premiere weather team. The Army and Air Force deserve no less.

# Back To Basics

## Conversion Of Officer To Enlisted Responsibilities Not A New Occurrence For Air Force Weather

I've read several articles lately that discuss increased responsibility for enlisted troops.

In the *Air Forces Times*, *Airmen*, and *Air Force Magazine*, the articles describe how the military has converted traditional officer or senior noncommissioned officer jobs to lower ranks through drawdowns and officer-to-enlisted conversions.

Folks, Air Force Weather (AFW) has already done it several times and we're still doing it today.

Let me put that last statement in perspective. First, throughout the worldwide meteorological community weather observing is traditionally a non-degree job and forecasting is a degree profession.

A degree usually merits a commission in most militaries, or pay from the top end of the scale, if it's a civilian job. The Air Force (actually the Army Air Corps) realized early in the preparation for World War II that there were not enough meteorologists with degrees to satisfy the needs of the Army and Air Force.

Thus, we began the enlisted forecasting programs. At various times throughout our history, the percentage of enlisted forecasters fluctuated. However, one fact remained true. The science of meteorology at the weather station was directed by a degreed meteorologist.

In the late 1970s and early 1980s, the structure of the weather

station changed.

We charged the senior NCO in the organization to become the chief meteorologist. So now the senior officer and senior NCO "shared" the meteorologist duties while managing the operations and taking care of the troops.

Then along came the various drawdowns of the 1980s and 1990s, many of which were targeted at the mid-level NCOs — just at the level that we put the responsibility for the day-to-day

forecasting. We lowered the high-year-of-tenure for senior NCOs and slowed their promotions.

The result? A tremendous loss of enlisted experience.

Today, we're in the midst of the officer-to-enlisted conversions. We converted the majority to the master and technical sergeant level because the officer billets converted were highly technical. However, we haven't

yet realized the results of the conversions. Probably in 1996, the Air Force will review the structure of each career field to ensure a proper grade alignment, one percent chief, two percent senior, etc.

The "overages" Air Force-wide will be the target of any future drawdowns. We can expect to draw down our expertise, again.

Our solution is to head off the technical drain through the implementation of "Back to Basics."

Air Weather Service Commander Col. Joseph D. Dushan addressed it in the November *OBSERVER*, and there have been several articles by Chief Master Sgt. Robert Brooks (See page 6).

Time and time again during the last year, I've heard senior Air Force officers outside of weather describe the best forecaster they ever knew. Time and time again that person had years of experience at our profession.

The skill in our profession is a direct result of experience, not adherence to checklist procedures.

I encourage you to study the back-to-basics program, and call the senior NCOs at your major command to make sure you understand the who, what, why, etc. I guarantee that your input is valuable as we bring this program up to speed.

Our goal is to improve our weather skills and ensure career progression and job satisfaction.

# Focus For Enlisted

## New Roles And Responsibilities

In last month's column, the officers' roles in tomorrow's Air Force weather stations were examined.

That article stated that company grade officers will return to traditional roles to provide scientific leadership in day-to-day weather operations.

We're working with the Air Force Personnel Center to bring about this return to traditional roles.

This month we'll look at enlisted roles and responsibilities. Changes in 3-level training will affect how duties will be assigned in the weather station.

Some traditional forecasting tasks will shift to 3-levels and 5-levels before they return to the forecasting course at Keesler AFB, Miss., because of the extra training airmen now get at the 3-level school.

Our 3-levels now are getting about 18 weeks of training compared to the 12 weeks at the old Observer school. The extra six weeks is broken down into two weeks of combat/field skills and four weeks of meteorology and analysis.

The first challenge is how to use and develop their new technical training.

Most enlisted will start out as **Weather Apprentices** with formal training in observing, codes, climatology, atmospheric properties, and analysis. They'll observe the weather as their fundamental task, but they'll do much more.

The knowledge and skills the apprentices learn from the new 3-level course will give them the foundation to learn more about analysis and meteorological watch while they're on the job.

The Weather Apprentice will gradually take on more duties as he or she works towards his/her 5-level.

At about the three-year point, Apprentices upgrade to the 5-skill level. As **Weather Analysts**, they'll mostly do analysis and meteorological watch for the station.

They'll monitor communications circuits for significant events and parameters, interpret radar and satellite imagery, and perform basic analysis. Their ability to "observe" the weather will expand from the runway complex to a much larger area.

Within a year after earning the title of Weather Analyst, most 5-levels will return to the Able Fore-

caster course to receive their "A" suffix, and earn the title of Ahle Forecaster. A few fast-trackers may have already been through this course right after Weather Apprentice training.

**Able Forecasters** will do what forecasters have always done. The big difference will be in assuming more active roles as shift leaders.

Ahle Forecasters will have to recognize and exploit training opportunities for Weather Apprentices and Analysts during their shifts. By assuming this greater responsibility, they'll prepare for even greater leadership roles as 7-level **Weather Managers**.

On average, it'll take between seven to eight years to become a 7-skill level. Weather Managers will play a larger role in overseeing training and the duties of Able Forecasters, Weather Analysts, and Weather Apprentices.

They will also assume more responsibility for the technical aspects of forecasting for specific missions and during operationally critical weather.

As you can see, we're moving duties around. Why? These changes will allow a fairer and more equal distribution of work and create jobs appropriate for the skills Weather Apprentices will have as a result of the new 3-level course. The biggest challenge of all will be defining the role and duties of the Station Chief. That will be the topic of February's installment of "Back To Basics".

# The Opportunities Are There

**Seek Out Advice, Check Out The Almanac**

Even though there are many opportunities in AFW, they are not endless. Competition is stiff, especially when you consider the quality of today's weather officers. But today's military operations stretch the gamut from the earth's surface to the depths of outer space, or "from the mud to the sun".

You are an integral part of the operational team. That's why you carry the XXX AFSC. Commanders depend on your accurate and timely information, throughout the aerospace environment, to plan and direct mission activities. Inaccurate information costs lives, wastes resources, impairs readiness, and

undermines the successful execution of an operation. Again, take a good, long look at the back of this Almanac issue, think about what you want to do and where you want to do it.

Don't forget, you're not alone out there when it comes to career guidance. Get advice from your supervisors, squadron and group commanders and the Air Force Personnel Center assignments officer on which types of assignments would be right for you. Then, watch the ads on the Officers' Assignments System (OAS) and volunteer often.

I often hear "there are no jobs out

there for majors and lieutenant colonels." This simply isn't true. As of the fourth quarter of 1997, there will be approximately 138 (15W) authorizations for majors and 91 for lieutenant colonels.

Clearly there are opportunities out there, but the chance of your dream assignment being available when you want

it has become more remote. You might have to make some compromises when it comes to your duty locations or job types when you sit down to plan your career progression goals. That is, you might have to sacrifice duty location for your choice job or vice versa (depending on whether you're driven by personal or professional goals).

For example, you might volunteer for a job at a location that you may not find appealing to achieve your career goals. Or, you might volunteer for a job at a base/post you desire which may not necessarily be good for your career. Another option might be to volunteer for a position at a larger unit as a way to get your "foot in the door" of an organization. (i.e., move to your desired position after you've served part of your tour in another capacity)

Finally, you might consider competing for one of the "career broadening" assignments such as: operations support squadron commander and operations officer, space operations officer, Air Force Institute of Technology or Reserve Officer Training Corps instructor, professional military education instructor, or other non-traditional positions within classified organizations.

Just remember, the assignment should provide some payback to AFW in order for AFPC to approve it. That is, AFPC will consider not only how the job will impact your career, but what the job and its associated experiences and knowledge will allow you to bring to the table in future assignments.

The bottom line; be flexible (develop options) and do the very best you can at your current position.

# DWIN:

If you haven't heard yet, AFGWC has an initiative underway to establish a home page on the unclassified military internet (known as the NIPRNET). Officially, this program is called the Defense Weather Information Network (DWIN).

The homepage comes online this month and will initially provide access to all of the graphic products and satellite imagery currently on the Air Force Dial-In System (AFDIS). We have received several questions concerning the purpose of DWIN and what it will provide the end customer. Hopefully, this will answer those questions.

Our two primary vehicles for getting products to the end user are the Automated Weather Distribution System (AWDS) and AFDIS. AWDS is currently limited to the number and types of products that can be provided and requires a weather person in the loop, even when the end user is an aircrew member, an infantry member, or a strategic planner.

AFDIS is more flexible, but can be

confusing to use for the uninitiated. Our home page should fill the gap left by these two systems by providing a user-friendly, extremely flexible interface that the end customer can use to access our products.

World Wide Web (WWW) technology has quickly become the standard method of sending and receiving information on the information superhighway. The flexibility provided will greatly enhance AFGWC's ability to respond to you and your customers' weather information needs. By using on-line forms, users will be able to provide instant feedback on what they like or dislike about what is available, as well as let us know about new products that are needed.

Hotlinks to other locations (e.g., AFCCC, the Navy's Fleet Numerical

Oceanography and Meteorology Center, universities, etc.) will provide virtual one-stop shopping for your weather information needs. Finally, unlike other "systems", the use of a WWW server provides the customer maximum flexibility to use the hardware and operating system of their choice, as well as the ability to choose from a variety of commercial web browser software packages.

While our initial home page will only provide the AFDIS graphic products and satellite images, rest assured we are planning ahead for future enhancements. These include (but aren't limited to) animation, improved on-line help screens, access to alphanumeric products, and secure connectivity to allow access by the Tactical Forecast System.

Meteorological Process Review (MPR). The MPR is designed to help a unit improve its Local Analysis and Forecast Program. Two-person teams from AWS/XOT will spend a week with a unit to review forecast processes for



possible enhancement and technology insertion.

The team will work closely with the unit's technical experts to help document standard methodologies including regional forecast techniques and checklists for different weather patterns and scenarios.

MPRs are scheduled by unit invitation only and conducted on a non-retribution basis. Over 75 weather units have already requested an MPR visit. If you would like an MPR, contact your

lored for your individual base weather station—but the initial release will focus on core meteorological techniques.

erational weather forecasting crossfeed, case studies and WSR-88D applications. The workshops are designed for NWS lead forecasters and Scientific Operations Officers (SOOs), and may be most useful for Weather Flight Commanders and SWO/WWOs.

Although a full schedule is not yet available from the AMS, we do know that the next workshop will be held Feb. 24-25, 1996, in Seattle, Wash. ## Enjoy the Almanac, help keep the OBSERVER's quality high

**I**t's hard to believe it's been an entire year since the first magazine-format *OBSERVER* hit the stands.

It's been a year of dramatic change, both in the *OBSERVER* and Air Force Weather in general.

This edition, like last January's, contains the Air Force Weather Almanac, a comprehensive listing of every weather facility in the Air Force.

This year, I've added commercial phone numbers, fax numbers and electronic mail addresses where available. This was done to help you, the weather professional, have as much information as possible at your fingertips.

Even though this listing is as up-to-date as possible, in a list this size, there will always be a few errors, or a name misspelled, or a commander or station chief PCSing before it is published. Please excuse these anomalies and enjoy it for what it is -- the 1996 Weather Almanac.

A few questions still come up about the manner in which the *OBSERVER* is published. Once again, I'll attempt to answer them here.

First, I try to use every article that I receive. Due to space limitations, I haven't always been able to run as much as I've wanted. Under our contract, the *OB-*

*SERVER* is limited to 24 pages each month, and that includes the front and back covers. The articles from General Lennon, Colonel Dushan, CMSgt. Jim Hoy (AFW Senior Enlisted Advisor), and the officer career progression people are monthly fixtures. The main cover story is normally allocated four pages.

In the past, this hasn't left a whole lot of "flex" space for other articles. But thanks to the understanding of all parties involved, certain articles will be "rotated" on a monthly basis. AFGWC, AFCCC, and the Combat Weather Facility (at Hurlburt Field, Fla.) will publish one month and have the next month off.

Then XO and SY will have their turn to publish, while the centers have their down time. This will ensure at least three additional open pages per month for other stories. As you might have noticed in the July issue, two pages were dedicated to "Observations From The Field." This will be a standard section every month to showcase what *YOU* are doing in support of your wing, command and the Air Force.

Second, about deadlines. I work an average of six to eight weeks ahead of time. For example, the article you are reading now was written in late November, turned into the printer in mid-December, and mailed to the field in early January.

Some station chiefs and commanders have called me when they don't see the articles or "salutes" they might have sent in a month or two ago.

All I can ask is for your patience and understanding. I promise to use each and

every salute submission I get ... eventually. This section has proven to be a crowd favorite, with roughly 300 submissions per month. I wish I could put in more, but I'd have to make the type so tiny, you would need a magnifying glass to read it!

Right now, the *OBSERVER* is a one-person operation -- namely me! I edit and design every page in the magazine, take photos when needed, and write at least one article per month. I also run the HQ AWS public affairs program, which includes news releases, photography, and whatever other little design projects pop up. I also go TDY once or twice a month to gather information or stay adept at my craft.

Within a few months, the AWS public affairs office will have two full-time Public Affairs NCOs assigned. When that happens, we can do even more for our audience and the rest of the Air Force.

So, what's this all mean? Just this -- my job is to bring you the best weather magazine anywhere.

What's your part? Tell me what's happening in your job — and in your life. I'll run human interest stories about weather warriors, but you have to send them in. I don't have a little radar on top of my office that sniffs out stories -- I need your input!

## New 'Air Force Weather' logo unveiled



### DID YOU KNOW ...

On Mar. 9, 1942, the Air Corps and old GHQ (General Headquarters) organizations were abolished along with the Weather Section in favor of a Weather Directorate.

This new directorate was born as part of the Army Air Forces' Operations Staff's Directorate of Technical Services, under the auspices of the Army Air Forces' Commander Maj. Gen. Henry "Hap" Arnold.

Maj. Don Zabriskie

Zimmerman was the first Director of Weather and in that capacity supervised the Army Air Force Weather Service.

### DID YOU KNOW ...

The present Directorate of Weather under the current command of Brig. Gen. Thomas Lennon, was re-established effective Feb. 5, 1991.

Brig. Gen. John J. Kelly, Air Weather Service Commander at the time, went to Washington, D.C., to assume the director's position while Col. George L. Frederick, Jr. became commander of the new Field Operating Agency, the Air Weather Service.

### DID YOU KNOW ...

This month we are featuring the new emblem representing the Directorate of Air Force Weather. (see illustration, right)

If you have not seen the emblem before, you will. The "new" emblem pictured here is, in fact, the "earliest known weather emblem" designed for Air Weather Service and therefore, is not new at all.

The first Directorate of Weather, back

weather and the fleur-de-lis indicated service in France during World War I. The motto "Coelum ad Proelium Elige," is Latin for the Air Weather Service motto.

Roughly translated it means "Choose the Weather for Battle." You say it looks familiar? It should! Where do you think the Air Weather Service emblem came from?

During World War II this logic did not necessarily apply, as can be seen in

the abundance of emblems that rose up during that time.

Within the weather community some of the elements more recognizable to you might be clouds with either rain or lightning or possibly assorted pieces of weather equipment.

We have all seen weather vanes attached to roofs of various buildings. However, as we all know, one of the most popular elements of a weather emblem is the ever-familiar anemometer cups.

**NOTE:** In today's Air Force the move toward standardization affects every facet of our jobs including emblems. A few of the basic guidelines used when designing an emblem are: it should accurately reflect the mission, include no more than three elements, and not be geographically specific.

This year when the Environmental Technical Applications Center (ETAC) became the Air Force Combat Climatology Center (AFCCC), they designed a new emblem.

The Combat Weather Facility was activated this year, and they too, designed an emblem. Both of these emblems have already been approved for use.

# OBSERVATIONS FROM THE FIELD

## Det. 7, AFGWC -- The Hub For Weather Information

**H**ave you ever stopped to think about where the alphanumeric weather products received at your AWDS or COMEDS terminal come from or the internal process involved in getting those products to you?

With the closure of Det. 40, RAF Croughton, England, and Det. 11, Hickam AFB, Hawaii, in Oct. 1994, the Automated Digital Weather Switch (ADWS) at Tinker AFB, Okla., became the main "HUB" for weather data communications worldwide. The ADWS is composed of Det. 7, AFGWC; the 72nd Communications Squadron; and Headquarters Standard Systems Group, OI-B. The primary job of these three organizations is to get alphanumeric weather data to you.

Det. 7 is made up of five distinct sections under two branches, systems and operations. Under the systems branch are the off-line and on-line programming sections.

The foundation of Det. 7, the off-line section, maintains the systems hardware and software necessary for the other sections to do their jobs. The on-line section builds, tests, and implements weather software programs that collect, process, and distribute weather products to the customer.

The operations branch is comprised of three separate, but integrated sections: data requirements, data acquisitions, and data control.

Data requirements interacts directly with you and is responsible for maintaining the routing of alphanumeric weather products, developing and maintaining Contingency/Exer-

cise packages, monitoring circuit utilization and ARQ statistics, and maintaining the Master Weather Message Library, a listing and description of weather products available over the Automated Weather Network (AWN).

Data acquisitions maintains the Master Station Catalog, a database containing descriptions of more than 14,000 weather reporting stations worldwide and manages the Global Weather Intercept Program (GWIP).

Data control provides a 24-hour point of contact for operations. They work with the Weather Network Duty Officer (WNDO), the communications interface of the AWN, to troubleshoot customer problems after duty hours, monitor data flow, perform data editing and a variety of data requirement functions after duty hours.

Presently, the WNDO is separate from the data control section, but we are working to co-locate them with Detachment 7 to improve customer support. Customers can contact the WNDO at DSN 884-5761 when circuit problems arise.

Det. 7 supports more than 600 customers worldwide. Half of those are U.S. military. We also support a wide variety of other DOD and civilian agencies, including the National Weather Service, Federal Aviation Administration, Johnson Space Center, and the Space Environmental Laboratory.

We provide support and weather data exchange to a wide variety of foreign government and civilian agencies such as the British Meteorological Organization, German Military Geophysics Office, Japanese Meteorological Agency, Korean Meteorological Agency, and the Republic of Korea and Japanese Air Forces.

To better support our many customers, we've instituted several new programs. We've developed a Bulletin Board which customers can access to obtain and download information such as Product Identification (PID) or MANOP number, the Master Station Catalog and the Master Weather Message Library (BIGBOY).

Although currently not available, our goal is to have each station's data requirements on the BBS. To gain access to the BBS you need to have a computer with a modem. Call DSN 339-7650 and complete the questionnaire. Access is granted within 5 work days.

We've also expanded our hours in the data requirements section to provide an overlap of duty hours with our customers in the European and Pacific theaters. Our new hours are from 0930Z to 0000Z Monday through Friday.
