
Accelerated Withdrawal Date

Most DoDDS-E Schools: May 17,2012

This policy recognizes that due to military necessity, families are occasionally required to move prior to the end of the school year and that children should not be penalized for this. The 20-day limit provides reasonable flexibility without compromising academic standards or placing the student in an untenable position in regard to mastery of curriculum content. This provision was never intended to apply to, or be extended for, the convenience of family travel, visits, or other discretionary reasons.

- Students must be in school all day on the last school day prior to the accelerated withdrawal date.
- The policy requires that students present verification of the date of their sponsor's PCS departure.
- Students who withdraw prior to the 20-day limit receive a "withdrawal" grade rather than a final grade.
