We have reviewed the final revision to the Commonwealth of Virginia regulations for Radiation Protection, received by our office on June 21, 2006. These regulations were reviewed by comparison to the equivalent Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) rules in 10 CFR Parts 19, 20, 30, 31, 32, 34, 35, 36, 39, 40, 61, 70, 71, and 150. We discussed our review of the regulations with you on October 18, 2006.

As a result of our review, we have 96 comments that have been identified in the enclosure. Please note that we have limited our review to regulations required for compatibility and/or health and safety. We have determined that if these regulations are revised, incorporating our comments and without other significant change, they would meet the compatibility and health and safety categories established in the Office of State and Tribal Programs (STP) Procedure [SA-200](#).

We request that when you revise your regulations to address our comments, a copy of the revised regulations, as proposed, be provided to us for review. As requested in STP Procedure [SA-201](#), "Review of State Regulatory Requirements," please highlight the location of any changes made by Virginia, in response to our comments and provide a copy to STP.
