
Now at Fort Eustis, TRADOC executes its mission through the headquarters staff and its major subordinate commands:

TRADOC oversees 32 Army schools organized under eight "Centers of Excellence," each focused on a separate area of expertise within the Army (such as Maneuver and Signal). These Centers train nearly 600,000 Soldiers and Servicemembers each year.
