# Planning: Bridging the Gap

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

- Evaluate Alternatives
- Make Decisions

#### Phase III - Application and Evaluation

- Implement the Plan
- Evaluate the Plan

# **Employing a Comprehensive Point**of View

No future without project condition?

- Looking at the consequences (e.g., physical/environmental, social, economic/financial governmental) of making a proposed decision;
- Establishing a community wide vision based on an active community participation process while addressing the needs and concerns of the community as a whole
- Provide general framework for guiding future development
