United States v. Lee

At trial the appellant was represented by civilian counsel and detailed military trial defense counsel. Prior to trial the military defense counsel was assigned to work as a trial counsel for the government, but remained on the appellant's defense team. The military defense counsel's new supervisor was the lead prosecutor in the appellant's case. The civilian counsel did not advise the appellant of any potential conflict. The appellant was ultimately convicted of various offenses including burglary, assault, and fraternization.
