Mortgagee Letters

The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) issues FHA Mortgagee Letters to inform lenders about Federal Housing Administration (FHA) operations, policies, procedures, and changes. You can reach HUD's FHA Mortgagee Letters website via the FHA Connection.

Accessing the HUD FHA Mortgagee Letters Page

To reach HUD's Mortgagee Letters website, use the Mortgagee Letters links found:

- in the footer of the FHA Connection Welcome page (and on other pages where that common footer appears) (**Figure 1**) (no sign on or authorization is required if accessing from the FHA Connection Welcome page)
- on the FHA Connection Main Menu (Figure 2) (requires sign on to the FHA Connection)




Figure 3: FHA Connection Single Family FHA Business Areas page link to Mortgagee Letters

- on the Single Family FHA menu (Figure 3) (requires sign on to the FHA Connection)




Figure 4: Mortgagee Letters page

All of the above links and the direct link listed below go to the FHA Mortgagee Letters page (**Figure 4**) on HUD's public website (no sign on or authorization required): http://www.hud.gov/offices/adm/hudclips/letters/mortgagee/index.cfm.

The FHA Mortgagee Letters website allows you to review/select from the current year's mortgagee letter titles or select from a list of links, year by year, to locate electronic copies of HUD mortgagee letters. Mortgagee letters have been issued since 1934; however the website lists only mortgagee letters from 1976 forward because HUD designates earlier issuances as obsolete.

Retrieving Mortgagee Letters

You may locate mortgagee letters using:

- Mortgagee Letter Titles: Review and select from the current year's mortgagee letter titles or select a specific year to review that year's mortgagee letter titles, or
- Keyword Search: Search HUD's mortgagee letter database for a specific topic.

Note: A keyword search is sometimes the most effective retrieval method, e.g., if you do not know the year that a mortgagee letter was issued or if you are unsure of the title.

To locate mortgagee letters related to a specific topic using the keyword search, do the following:

1. Enter one or two keywords in the Search Mortgagee Letters box (Figure 4) and click Search.

Accessing and Using HUD FHA Mortgagee Letters




Figure 5: Mortgagee Letters search example with no information found

2. If no information is found based on the entered keyword(s), a message is displayed indicating no matches were found (**Figure 5**). Enter new search criteria as needed or click Search Tips for helpful search suggestions. Entering more than one or two keywords may result in no documents found.




Figure 6: Mortgagee Letters search results sample

- 3. If information is found based on the entered keyword(s), the Search page appears with a list of all located mortgagee letters (**Figure 6**). A brief description and link to each mortgagee letter is provided. Links to the mortgagee letters are listed in groups of 10. The total number of letters located is also provided.
- 4. Use Next (located at both the top and bottom of the page) to go to the next consecutive page of the list, or you may go to a specific page by selecting from the page numbers provided at the bottom of the list.
- 5. You may sort the list by date or relevance to the search criteria entered. The default is by relevance.

Note: To further refine your search, you may use the Advanced Search option at the top of the page. This allows you to enter additional criteria and search within the retrieved list. You may also obtain additional search suggestions by selecting the Search Tips link at the top of the page.

Click a mortgagee letter link to view any of the located letters (Figure 7).
