President Bashir fires CAA Director General

Following yesterday's airplane crash which killed four Russian nationals, President Bashir has "relieved the Director General of the Civil Aviation Authority of his duties." President Bashir also banned all Ilyushin and Antonov aircraft from flying in Sudan. (*Al-Sahafa, Ajras al-Hurriya*)

GoSS asks Ugandan army to leave

The Government of Southern Sudan (GoSS) has asked the Ugandan army to exit southern Sudan due to "mistakes made in chasing the Lord's Resistance Army." (Al-Rai al-Aam)

"Verbal clash" of Sudanese and Chadian MFAs

At the African Union Summit in Sharm el Sheikh, Egypt, the Sudanese and Chadian Ministers of Foreign Affairs accused each other of attacking their countries. After this confrontation, the proposed meeting between Presidents Bashir and Deby did not occur. (*Al-Sudani*)

Abdul Wahid welcomes chief negotiator

Abdul Wahid Mohamed el-Nur, the leader of the Sudan Liberation Army/Abdul Wahid faction, has "welcomed the appointment" of Djibrill Bossole of Burkina Faso as the full-time chief negotiator for Darfur. (*Al-Sudani*)

Presidency to meet on Abyei

With the arrival of Salva Kiir in Khartoum, the Presidency will meet today to finalize the arrangements on the previously agreed-upon administration of the Abyei region. (*Al-Sahafa*)

Salva Kiir rejects results of census in the South

Addressing a rally, First Vice President of the Government of National Unity and the President of the Government of Southern Sudan Salva Kiir said that "not all of the South has been covered" in the recent census. Kiir also criticized the omission of religion and race on the census forms. (*Ajras al-Hurriya*)
