What is HIPAA?

The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) of 1996 was established to protect the privacy of patient health information. This act secures individually identifiable healthy information that is transmitted or maintained by electronic or any other form or medium. All personnel, contractors, interns, volunteers and providers working within a USAMEDDAC facility are required to be informed and aware of their responsibilities. USAMEDDAC is committed to the protection of patient confidentiality, the maintenance of integrity and the maintenance of security, during the collection, aggregation, analysis, storage, and destruction of protected health information. USAMEDDAC has established systems to safeguard patient privacy without disrupting the quality of health care and enforcing the rights of patients with respect to health information privacy.

COMPLAINT PROCESS

- All HIPAA complaints should be routed to the Privacy Officer
- The Privacy Officer processes, investigates and tracks all complaints
- The Privacy Officer documents all complaints in the Protected Health Information Management Tool (PHIMT) upon receipt.
