Lieutenant General Mark A. Milley graduated from Princeton University with a Bachelor's in Political Science in 1980, and he was commissioned an Army officer through Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC). Lieutenant General Milley has had multiple command and staff positions in seven divisions and Special Forces over the last 32 years.

His initial assignment was as assistant battalion maintenance officer; later platoon leader, A Company, 4th Battalion, 68th Armored Regiment, 82nd Airborne Division, 18th Airborne Corps, Fort Bragg, N.C., and later the 5th Special Forces Group at Fort Bragg, N.C. He then attended the Infantry Officer Advanced Course, after which, he was reassigned to a Combat Support Brigade, 7th Infantry Division (Light) at Fort Ord, Calif., where he served as an assistant S3 (Operations), commanded two light infantry companies, and was the battalion S3 in the 5th Battalion, 21st Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division (Light), Fort Ord. Upon completion of the Army Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kan., he served with the 10th Mountain Division (Light), Fort Drum, N.Y., as the 2nd Brigade Combat Team S3 and executive officer. He was reassigned to the 1st Battalion, 506th Infantry Regiment (Air Assault), 2nd Infantry Division, 8th U.S. Army, South Korea, followed by duty as a Senior Battalion Task Force Observer/Controller, Operations Group, Joint Readiness Center, Fort Polk, La. Following the Naval War College, Lieutenant General Milley served as the G3 (Operations) and Chief of Staff for the 25th Infantry Division (Light), Schofield Barracks, Hawaii. After deploying and serving as the Commander, United States Provisional Brigade/Task Force Eagle, 25th Infantry Division (Light), Multinational Division (North), Eagle Base, Bosnia-Herzegovina; he returned to Fort Drum and took command of the 2nd Brigade Combat Team (Commando), 10th Mountain Division (Light) and led the "Commandos" on deployments to both Afghanistan and Iraq. During the deployment to Iraq, the 2nd Brigade Combat Team (Commando) was attached to the 1st Cavalry Division. He was reassigned as the Joint Operations Division Chief on The Joint Staff in Washington, D.C., and later served as the Military Assistant to the Secretary of Defense. He next served as Deputy Commanding General (Operations), 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault), Fort Campbell, Ky., and deployed as the DCG(O) for Regional Command-East, Afghanistan, and then as the Joint Staff's Deputy Director for Regional Operations (DDRO/J33 Current Operations) at the Pentagon. Lieutenant General Milley's most recent assignment was as the Commanding General, 10th Mountain Division (Light) and Fort Drum.



His operational deployments include: the Multinational Force and Observers (MFO), Sinai, Egypt; Operation JUST CAUSE, Panama; Operation UPHOLD DEMOCRACY, Haiti; Operation JOINT ENDEAVOR, Bosnia-Herzegovina; Operation IRAQI FREEDOM, Iraq; and Operation ENDURING FREEDOM, Afghanistan.

Lieutenant General Milley's education includes a Bachelors Degree in Political Science from Princeton University, and Masters Degrees from Columbia University (International Relations) and from the United States Naval War College (National Security and Strategic Studies). He is also a graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Seminar XXI National Security Studies Program.

Lieutenant General Milley's awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal (3OLC), Legion of Merit (2OLC), Bronze Star Medal (3OLC), Meritorious Service Medal (5OLC), Army Commendation Medal (4OLC), Army Achievement Medal (1OLC), Joint Meritorious Unit Award, Meritorious Unit Commendation, National Defense Service Medal (1 Bronze Star), Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal (2 Bronze Stars), Afghanistan Campaign Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Korean Service Defense Medal, Humanitarian Service Medal, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon (4), NATO Service Medal, and the Multinational Force and Observers Medal. He is authorized to wear the Combat Infantryman Badge (with star), Expert Infantryman Badge, Master Parachutist Badge, Scuba Diver Badge, Ranger Tab, Special Forces Tab, and Joint Chiefs of Staff Identification Badge.
