Post Gains Coveted Environmental Status

Fort A.P. Hill has moved up a significant notch in the Virginia Environmental Excellence Program (VEEP), achieving "Exemplary Environmental Enterprise" (E3) status.

The program, sponsored by the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality, enables participants to receive fee discounts for certain permits and some administrative flexibility in addressing environmental regulations.

Fort A.P. Hill is the first military installation in Virginia to achieve E3 designation. The Defense Supply Center depot in Richmond leads Department of Defense participants in the program, having been designated as one of only 11 facilities statewide to achieve E4 status, or "Extraordinary Environmental Enterprise."

The E4 status is reserved for applicants that have fully implemented an environmental management system (as verified by an independent third party) and has committed to measures for continuous and sustainable environmental management and community involvement, according to the DEQ

The law states that facilities achieving E3 and E4 designation may have improved monitoring and reporting requirements, streamlined permit renewals, and the ability to make certain operational changes without prior approval and other changes that would not increase a facility's impact on the environment.

Fort A.P. Hill's Environmental Division, a component of the Directorate of Public Works, coordinates the installation's participation with DEQ.

A.P. Hill Remembers 9/11

A large number of Fort A.P. Hill employees who were able to briefly break from their duties of assisting warriors prepare for combat gathered at the garrison headquarters Monday to pay homage to the nearly 2,900 American lives lost on Sept. 11, 2001 in the terrorist attacks on the nation.

The group gathered at 8:46 a.m., the time the first plane was crashed into the World Trade Center in New York.

Lt. Col. Michael S. Graese, installation commander, noted, "Much like an earlier generation's experience of knowing the exact thing they were doing when they heard about the shooting of President Kennedy, our generation will never forget where we were when we heard about these attacks.

He said the country has been at war for much of the five years since the attacks on innocent civilians.

"...Sometimes, Americans seem to have short memories, but we should never forget the victims and their families or the historical significance of this event.

"In addition to those killed or wounded in the original attacks, we should never forget or take for granted the 2,921 Americans killed in action or the 20,372 wounded in action since 9/11.

"If you ever question the criticality of our mission here at Fort A.P. Hill, just remember these attacks. They make our mission and vision most critical," Graese said.

Division Chief Terry L. Banks said, "We submitted comprehensive documentation that demonstrated we have a fully compliant environmental management system. This includes such key areas as pollution prevention, an emergency management program, and regular self-inspections and audits.

"We also had to show that we had an active training program for employees, not only in the environmental division, but installation wide. This designation reflects on the entire installation's success in this area."

Banks said the status should allow the installation to save several thousand dollars annually in permitting fees for such areas

as hazardous waste, solid waste and water quality. Discounts ranging from 5 to 20 percent are available for E3 status facilities.

To continue its march toward E4 status, Fort A.P. Hill be required to report annually to DEQ on progress towards imple-

mentation of the environmental management system and pollution prevention program, according to a letter announcing the E3 designation that was signed by Michael P. Murphy of DEQ's Division of Environmental Enhancement.
