Project Background

The Western Federal Lands Highway Division (WFLHD) of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), in cooperation with the Coos County Highway Department and the U.S. Forest Service, has established a project on the Powers-Agness Highway (County Road 90). Tidewater Contractors based in Brookings OR. is beginning construction this summer on the two-year project. The project begins at the southern city limits of Powers OR and continues approximately 4 miles to the Siskiyou National Forest boundary.

The purpose of the project is to maintain access to National Forest lands, as well as to recreation, commercial, and residential uses in the project vicinity. The project will also improve safety and drainage issues as well as reduce maintenance needs. Major work items include replacing culverts, reinforcing fills, road realignment, and installing a bridge

Progress Report

Over the past week construction on the project included excavation and clearing operations.

Construction Progression (for the week of June 20th)

Crews will continue excavation and clearing operations at the Hayes Creek bridge site. Road construction activities will also take place at the Mill Creek road relocation site. .

Traffic Information

As construction activities continue this upcoming week, expect delays of less than 30 minutes. Utility relocation work is also underway which can also delay traffic in this section of road.
