SUBJECT: Nameplate Policy for Fort Hood Housing Residents

1. REFERENCES. None.
2. APPLICABILITY. This policy applies to all residents of Fort Hood housing.
3. POLICY.
  - a. Effective immediately, nameplates will be displayed on all Fort Hood Family housing. Displaying the name and rank of the current occupant of each housing unit is essential, for security reasons. In the event of an emergency or potential criminal matter, such as an emergency response to a domestic disturbance, nameplates may be necessary to ensure security personnel have the correct house.
  - b. The visual identification of occupants on each Fort Hood home will also assist the Community Life NCO and Village Supporting Unit to locate occupants when needed.
  - c. Nameplates show pride in your home and they do not violate the Privacy Act. Soldiers and Family members will adhere to this policy and will not prevent the placement of nameplates on the homes.
  - d. Initial cost of the nameplates will be paid by the Residential Communities Initiative (RCI) Private Partner; however, replacement could be at the expense of the tenant, if removed or damaged.
4. EXPIRATION. This Fort Hood Command Policy Memorandum supersedes Command Policy DPW-02, dated 2 November 2009, and will remain in effect until superseded or rescinded.
