NOTICE OF COMMISSION DECISION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE FOR COMPLETION OF THE INVESTIGATION

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 47) of the presiding administrative law judge ("ALJ") extending the target date for completion of the above-captioned investigation by three months to November 18, 2013.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on April 17, 2012, based on a complaint filed by LSI Corporation of Milpitas, California and Agere Systems Inc. of Allentown, Pennsylvania. 77 Fed. Reg. 22803-04. The complaint, as amended, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, by reason of infringement of certain claims of the following U.S. Patent Nos: 5,870,087; 6,452,985; 6,707,867; and 6,982,663. The complaint further alleges the existence of a domestic industry. The Commission's notice of investigation named several respondents including Funai Electric Company, Ltd. of Osaka, Japan; Funai Corporation, Inc. of Rutherford, New Jersey; and Funai Service Corporation of Groveport, Ohio (collectively, "Funai").

On October 5, 2012, respondent Funai filed a motion seeking a sixteen-week extension of the procedural schedule and target date for this investigation. Funai asserted that additional discovery time was needed in view of the ALJ issuing Order No. 41 on October 1, 2012, which granted complainants' leave to amend the complaint to expand the scope of the accused products. Complainants filed a response contending that a two-month extension was sufficient to address the remaining discovery issues.

On October 25, 2012, the ALJ issued the subject ID extending the target date of the investigation by three months from August 19, 2013 to November 18, 2013, and the deadline for his final initial determination from April 19, 2013 to July 18, 2013. He found that a three-month extension was sufficient in view of the complexity of the issues raised in this investigation and the outstanding discovery issues that remain to be resolved. No party petitioned for review of the ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, and in section 210.42(h) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 19 C.F.R. § 210.42(h).
