## Re-Entry and Sanctions Center (RSC) Fact Sheet

Located in the historic Karrick Hall building on the grounds of DC General Hospital, the CSOSA Re-Entry and Sanctions Center provides high-risk offenders and defendants with intensive assessment and reintegration programming and imposes residential sanctions for offenders and defendants who violate the conditions of their release. Once fully operational, the RSC will serve 102 offenders/defendants in six units. Two of the six units are dedicated to meeting the needs of women and dually diagnosed offenders/defendants.

Offenders/defendants assigned to the RSC will participate in a 28-day holistic and multi-disciplinary program. Treatment readiness and motivation is the focus of each of the interventions offered at the RSC. These interventions are structured to address one or more of the following factors that challenge offenders'/defendants' successful reentry:

- o Psychological disorders
- o Substance abuse
- o Cognitive impairments
- o Psychopathy
- o Post incarceration syndrome
- o Protracted withdrawal
- o Complicated bereavement
- o Criminogenic factors
- o Anxiety
- o Poor attachment/social bonding
- o Developing social supports
- o Medical issues
- o Financial readiness
- o Housing

RSC offenders/defendants will also receive counseling, a complete physical, psychological, and behavioral assessment; and a referral to inpatient, residential or daily outpatient substance abuse treatment programs. Upon completion of the program, offenders/defendants are equipped with the tools needed to: prevent relapse, succeed in a treatment modality, adhere to supervision requirements, improve familial relationships, and initiate productive community reintegration.
