The Project will have a developmental impact on the host country, Jordan, as well as the regional market where solar solutions are implemented. The Project will accelerate IETI's expansion of services related to large scale solar water heating, large scale solar space heating, swimming pool heating, and solar cooling. This focus on renewable energy will reduce dependence on imported energy sources and support Jordan's national energy strategy. IETI will support the local economy by generating jobs, using some Project funds for local procurement, providing additional tax revenue, and introducing innovative management and distribution strategies. IETI employees will be supported with formal training and a range of other benefits.
Design, installation, and maintenance services of passive solar systems are typically screened as Category B under OPIC's environmental guidelines because impacts are site specific and readily mitigated. The primary environmental and social concern is related to worker safety and the assurance that appropriate health and safety measures are in place for workers while installing the systems.  Applicable Standards. IETI and its subcontractors will be required to adhere to (i) applicable sections of the International Finance Corporation's 2007 General Environmental Health and Safety Guidelines and (ii) all applicable environmental, health and safety requirements of Jordan.  Impacts and Mitigation Measures. The Project entails the financing, installation, and maintenance of solar heating and cooling equipment, primarily for large scale solar water, space, and pool heating applications.  IETI will not manufacture solar collectors; rather, equipment will be purchased by IETI and installed and maintained by IETI or its subcontractors. Health and safety procedures will be in place. Appropriate personal protective equipment will be given to all workers when installing equipment on site. Additionally, all employees will receive training before beginning work.
