	European countries. It will help fill a financing gap for			
	medium and large companies in the host country market, as the			
	current credit crisis has reduced the amount of liquidity			
	available for equipment leasing. The Project will lead to the			
	creation of some new local professional jobs, which will			
	receive strong employee benefits and training. As the Project			
	partially targets the SME sector, it should result in downstream			
	multiplier effects throughout the local economy.			
Environment:	Loans from OPIC to financial institutions that lease IT and			
	other office equipment are considered financial transactions			
	and are screened as Category C Projects having no material			
	environmental impacts. Environmental, health and safety			
	concerns are minimal and no further analysis is required.			
	However, in order to ensure that the Project's leases are			
	consistent with OPIC statutory and policy requirements, OPIC			
	will require that the Borrower not use the proceeds of OPIC			
	loan to lease industrial or construction equipment (including			
	those used in extractive industries).
