INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

ACCEPTANCE: This is to advise you that those individuals in Enclosure 1 have been accepted for participation in the Training Course (H-314), "Safety Aspects of Well Logging." This course is scheduled to be presented April 23-27, 2012 at Schlumberger Technology Corporation's training facility, 210 Schlumberger Drive, Sugar Land, Texas, a Houston suburb.

COURSE: The course starts at 8:00 a.m. each morning beginning on Monday, April 23, 2012. The daily sessions will end at approximately 5:00 p.m. each day except that the course will end at noon on Friday, April 27, 2012. Cellular phones and similar devices with audible capability should be disabled while classes are in session. Normal office/business attire is appropriate for students attending TTC courses.

LODGING AND TRAVEL: You should plan to arrive on Sunday, April 22, 2012 and depart on Friday, April 27, 2012. Participants must make their own lodging arrangements. If traveling by air, you need to contact Carlson Travel at 1-866-250-2160 for airline reservations. You can also go to the same website to receive a copy of the travel instructions and voucher for reimbursement, as well as the tax exemption form. No rental cars will be authorized for travel. Individuals should request a Federal government rate at the hotels. The per diem for Houston, Texas is 109/71/180. This means lodging/meals/not to exceed total. Tax should be exempt in Houston. Texas has made lodging arrangements with the Sugar Land Marriott Town Square, 16090 City Walk, Sugar Land, Texas 77479.
