#### **INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS**

<u>ACCEPTANCE:</u> This is to advise you that those individuals in Enclosure 1 have been accepted for participation in the training course (H-1 15), "Characterization and Planning for Decommissioning." This course is scheduled to be presented November 5-9, 2012, at the Professional Development Center in Bethesda, Maryland. The course is located, at 7201 Wisconsin Avenue, Suite 425. It is located 3.5 blocks from the Bethesda Metro stop. For non headquarters personnel traveling to the training, we suggest that you stay at a hotel that is on the metro line for your convenience.

<u>COURSE</u>: This course will be conducted beginning at 8:00 a.m. and end at 5:00 p.m. each day except for Friday, November 9, 2012 when the class is scheduled to end at 3:00 p.m. A course outline is enclosure (Enclosure 3). Students should bring an engineering or scientific calculator with them. Normal office/business attire is appropriate for students attending NRC courses.

LODGING & TRAVEL: You should plan to arrive on Sunday, November 4, 2012, and depart on Friday, November 9, 2012. Participants must make their own lodging and travel arrangements. Individuals should request a Federal government rate at the hotels. The per diem for the Bethesda, Maryland area is 183/71/254. This means lodging/meals/not to exceed the total. Return flights should not be scheduled prior to 1 hour after completion of the course which will allow sufficient time for travel from the Professional Development Center to the airport. Tax is a separate line item on your voucher. The Federal mileage reimbursement is 55.5 cents per mile. If traveling by air, you need to contact Carlson Travel at 1-866-250-2160 for airline reservations. No rental cars will be authorized.
