#### SCHOOL-AGE CENTER (SAC) 2012 SUMMER DAY CAMP FACT SHEET



#### Welcome to the 2012 SAC Summer Day Camp!!

This program will consist of nine (9) one-week sessions for children completing the 1<sup>st</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grades. **Program starts 18 June 2012 and concludes 17** August 2012. The Day Camp Program is sponsored by Child, Youth and School (CYS) Services and is operated in cooperation with the University of Northern Iowa (UNI) Camp Adventure Program. The University selects and trains college students from UNI and partner universities throughout the United States to become Camp Adventure counselors. These counselors will be responsible for the daily activities during Day Camp hours, 0800-1600, Monday through Friday, with the assistance and supervision of SAC staff. Children enrolled in the SAC full-day program will be participating in the 0800-1600, and the Before and After Care SAC Program (0545-0800/1600-1800) (non-SAC participants are encouraged to participate in the Camp Program on a SPACE-AVAILABLE basis). Summer Day Camp will be held at Yongsan SAC, Bldg. # 4211. Exceptional Family Members will be, when feasible, mainstreamed into regular Day Camp Programs. Visit the EFMP Coordinator prior to registration. Camp will continue, rain or shine – please dress your children appropriately. Lunches and afternoon snacks will be provided. Swim suit, sunscreen, and towels should be brought to camp Tuesday(1st,2nd) and Thursday(3rd-5th). Off / On base Field trips will be scheduled for Wednesday (1st & 2nd/3rd-5th).

#### DAY CAMPACTIVITIES WILL INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOWING:

#### REFUND POLICY:

- 1. Cancellation of enrollment must be made by 1200 hours the Wednesday prior to the start of the desired session.
- 2. Exception for a total refund would be: Medical slip stating the child cannot participant or receipt of PCS Orders/Emergency orders.
- 3. No refund of the enrollment fee (regardless of circumstances) when the withdrawal is requested after 1200 hours on Wednesday, except as noted in #2 above.
- 4. No refunds when children are removed from the program because of behavioral problems.

DAY CAMP HOURS/DAYS: Day Camp operates from 0800 to 1600, Monday through Friday (excluding the holiday on 4 July).

**DAILY LUNCHES AND FRIDAY BARBECUE LUNCH:** CYSS Policy states that outside food and/or refreshments cannot be allowed in the SAC facility and program. CYS Services will provide lunches for the children each day. Parents are welcome and encouraged to attend the Friday Barbecue Lunch. Please register with the Camp Director or SAC each week if you plan to have lunch with your child(ren) on Friday.

SUMMER DAY CAMP FIELD TRIP INFORMATION: Each session of camp includes a field trip on Wednesdays and, these are day-long trips. Please ensure that your child is at Camp at the designated time and properly prepared, since the buses will depart on schedule. Please remember that if a child is late for the bus or you do not want your child to attend a field trip, the alternate care will be provided. WEEK IV will be the ONLY Wednesday where ALL grades will be participating in the Field Trip. No staff will be at the center to provide supervision. We are scheduled to return to SAC by 1530-1600. As you know, the traffic, as well as the weather, in Korea can create problems. In the event the busses are running behind schedule, please assist us by being patient.

Parent permission slips for field trips will be distributed and collected by SAC or Camp staff each week. For children enrolled in multiple weeks, a single parent permission slip that includes all trips can be signed during Week I. Admission fees for the trip will be paid by CYS Services. Parents determine extra money (Won) for souvenirs. However, please do not give your child more than 10,000 Won.

Children are required to bring their backpack (light/non-book bag) on field trips, since he/she required

to cassy his;her lunch and extra waters. Parents/guardians are welcome to attend the trip on a space-available basis. Please make your request to attend the trip to the Camp Director **prior to Tuesday noon**. Parents are responsible for their own admission fees.

**BEHAVIOR** during the 2012 Summer Day Camp should be such that no camper's actions have a negative effect on the others' enjoyment and safety. The entire staff will enforce rules to maintain order and an appropriate environment for all campers. Disciplinary action will include: removing the child from the group; counseling the child on expected behavior; notifying the parents about the situation; and, if the problem persists, dismissing the child for the remainder of the day/week/program. We request the assistance and cooperation of all parents/guardians in this matter. We have no intention of dismissing any child from the program. Please work with us to ensure that everybody has an enjoyable summer. It must also be understood that no refunds will be given for children removed from the program due to disciplinary problems.

In event the incident/situation occurs during a field trip, off the CYSS-SAC premises; parent, guardian, and/or emergency contact will be notified and will be required to pick-up his/her child (ren). Child (ren) may not be able to participate in one and/or all the field trips unless accompanied by a parent, guardian, and/or emergency contact.

**LEARN-TO-SWIM CLASS SCHEDULE AND SKILL LEVEL CHECK LIST:** Class schedules for Yongsan Pool are located at the Parent Central office and the School-Age Care Center. Families must register for these classes through the Parent Central office which is located at the ACS Building 4106, Room 121. After 1 June, the Parent Central will be located in S-5210 (next to the Katusa Snack Bar)

**CANCELLATION POLICY:** All LTS classes will be canceled if there is lightning within a ten (10) mile radius. Classes will resume if no lightning is observed during a 1-hour period. During Monsoon season, classes may be cancelled due to the heavy rains; it is the responsibility of the parents to call School-Age Care at 738-4707 before 0800 and to call Parent Central at 738-3001/5036 or the Pool at 738-4537 to confirm class schedules after 0800. In case of rain, classes

may be moved to the Indoor Swimming Pool #3, Bldg 1515, located on Main Post.

Class schedules are subject to change; if there is less than 50% participation for a class, that class may be canceled and replaced by a class with greater demand. If a class is canceled by Child, Youth and School (CYS) Services, all participants in the canceled class will be offered a replacement class or will receive a full refund.

PAYMENT PROCEDURES: Payment for the first session will start on 11 June 2012. Payments must be made by 1200 Thursday, 14 June, or parents risk losing their child's spot. (For subsequent sessions, payments must be made by 1200 the Thursday of the week preceding the start of each session.) The Instructional Program Specialist (IPS) will notify the Family of the time and level for each child along with a payment deadline; phone call reminders for a payment will only be made at the start of each session.

#### REFUND POLICY:

- 1. An administrative charge of \$5.00 (non-refundable) is built into the registration fee.
- 2. Cancellation of enrollment must be made by 1200 the Monday prior to the start of the desired session.
- 3. Exception for a total refund (minus the \$5.00 administrative charge) would be:
  - a. Medical slip stating the child cannot participate or
  - b. Receipt of PCS Orders/Emergency orders.
- 4. No refund of registration fee regardless of circumstances when the withdrawal is requested after 1200 hours on Wednesday, except as noted in #3 above.
- 5. Refunds take a minimum of two (2) weeks to process through the Central Accounting Division.
- 6. No refunds when children are removed from the program because of behavioral problems.
- 7. Any refunds submitted after 30 days from the beginning of the LTS session in which the child is enrolled will not be accepted.

**BEHAVIOR** during the 2012 Learn-to-Swim (LTS) Program should be such that no swimmer's actions have a negative effect on the others' enjoyment. The entire staff will enforce rules to maintain safety, order, and an appropriate environment for all swimmers. Disciplinary action will include: removing the child from the group; counseling the child on expected behavior; notifying the parent(s) about the situation; and, if the problem persists, dismissing the individual for the remainder of the day/week/program. We request the assistance and cooperation of all parents/guardians in this matter. We have no intention of dismissing any child/youth from the program. Please work with us to ensure that everybody has an enjoyable and safe summer. It must also be understood that no refunds will be given for children or youth removed from the program due to disciplinary problems.

**REGISTRATION PROCEDURES:** Registration for Learn-to-Swim classes is conducted at the Parent Central office, Bldg 4106, Room 121. Registration is taken during the hours listed below:


