The Annual Meeting will be held in downtown Salt Lake City. Tonya and Amber will work together to secure a location.

We will begin the morning of Tuesday April 24th, and spend two full days in a conference room setting. The Annual Meeting will conclude on with a field visit of nearby Kennecott Copper Mine the morning of Thursday April 26th.

The theme of the annual meeting will be how each state approaches bond release. As such, please have the title and concept of your presentation (~30 minutes each) ready for the agenda by the next WRTT conference call. Some states have voiced that they would like to tie mobile computing applications into how they process bond release applications. This is great, as it advances an e-permitting component that the WRTT group has been working towards. However, some states may not be fully integrated in applying mobile computing technology. Fear not. This is a format to exchange information so we can ALL grow and develop better solutions. Therefore, aim to develop presentations highlighting examples of how efficiency and effectiveness were increase through your bond release process, lessons learned during implementation of your process, or even what your current process is but the direction your program may be advancing.

This information exchange is meant to advance regulatory programs, not to identify flaws with particular programs.

WRTT Member Reports/Information

Alaska: Russ Kirkham. Permit application for Chuitna Mine is consuming staff's time.

Colorado: Sandy Brown. Most things quite with holiday season.

Montana: Angela McDannel. Two permit applications being developed, but will may be a year before submitted. Working on an electronic filing and archiving project. Managing personnel shortfalls.

New Mexico: David Clark. No significant coal issues, but Uranium mines becoming a hot topic in the region.

North Dakota: Jim Deutsch. Falkirk Mine submitted application to add 5,000 additional acres. Looking to pursue the addition of a GIS specialist to the program.

Utah: Amber Fortner. EIS for a new mine in Alton being done. Utah American Energy encountered hazardous levels of methane during operations, triggering the layoff of over a hundred personnel. Utah program continues to manage budget shortfalls.

Wyoming: Marcelo Calle. WDEQ Information Technology (IT) Initiative continues.

Budget request for implementation phase of the WDEQ IT Project was presented to Joint Appropriations Committee (JAC) and was well accepted. Monies will likely be allocated to implementation and completion of the IT project incrementally through Three Phases (Proof of Concept, Pilot Implementation and Full Implementation).

Completion will support enhanced "electronic business", better coordination and data access across divisions as well as more business "transparency" for the public and regulated community through web based applications. The completed project will include a WDEQ enterprise GIS environment though the use of ArcGIS Server and ArcSDE. Land Quality Division continues to develop guidance to support Bond Release processing as well as continued devolvement of GIS for Bond Release Tracking and GPS enabled Tablet PC mobile computing applications to support regulatory.

ABQ Field Office: Willis Gainer. No Report.

Casper Field Office: Alan Boehms. No new activities of interest to group.

Denver Field Division: Howard Strand. Continuing to pursue the addition of an intern.

Denver Program Support Division: Karen Jass. Navajo Mine (NM), Black Mesa/Kayenta Mine Complex (AZ), and McKinley Mine (NM) have all initiated efforts to implement Natural Regrade reclamation techniques with encouragement from OSM. Absaloka Mine (MT/Crow) will submit a permit application in January. Centralia Mine (WA) made a corporate decision to discontinue mining operations due to a lack of profitability at the location.
