Health, Justice, Women: Behavioral Health and OB/GYN

Data continue to show that women are entering the justice system at rates exceeding male offenders and bring with them extremely complex and multi-layered behavioral and physical health issues. Systems must choose how best to deploy limited staffing and programming resources. The *Health, Justice, Women* broadcast series is an effort to help justice systems explore methods of coordination between their behavioral and women's health care systems. "Health, Justice, Women: Behavioral Health and OB/GYN" is the second in the two-part series addressing health-related issues with women in our nation's justice system.

The broadcast will look closely at areas introduced in the first broadcast, especially those issues related to the complexities of behavior, obstetrics, and gynecology that affect all women in the justice system. It will address the behavioral, mental, and physical, and reproductive health issues that affect women throughout their lives but pose broad challenges for agencies.

During this discussion in a national broadcast sponsored by the National Institute of Corrections, participants will:

- Explore how research from the Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) study, the National Prevention Strategy (NPS), and others can inform correctional health practices for justice-involved women.
- Explore models in correctional settings of evidence-based behavioral and women's health services.
- Identify how professional health care organizations continue to contribute to correctional health care for women.
- Initiate agency-based conversations regarding creation of and/or enhancement of health care practices for women..
