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Heavy showers and rain, that exceeded 11 inches in a 24-hour period over some parts of the windward section of the Big Island of Hawaii, were associated with a stationary shear line. The deluge forced the closure of several roads from Waipio Valley to upslope areas in the Puna District. The rain also triggered landslides that halted traffic on other streets and roadways. The cost of damages was not available. No serious injuries were reported.
