Police reported up to 8 inches of standing water on Alii Drive **Hawaii County** Hilo 07 08 1930HST 0030HST Urban/Sml Stream Fld More than 3 inches of rainfall occurred in Hilo between 5 p.m. and 10 p.m. on the 7th resulting in widespread minor street flooding. **Hawaii County** 9 SW Kamuela 09 0400HST 0 **Urban/Sml Stream Fld** Runoff from heavy showers over higher terrain of the South Kohala District produced minor flooding in Waikoloa Village. **Honolulu County** Pearl City to Makakilo City 09 1230HST 1630HST 0 Urban/Sml Stream Fld Heaviest rainfall occurred over the Waianae Mountains where radar estimated 3 to 4 inches of rainfall and isolated amounts up to 6 inches in a 3 hour period. Minor road flooding reported in Pearl City and Moanalua areas **Honolulu County** 1750HST 2000HST Waianae to 0 Urban/Sml Stream Fld 09 Honolulu Minor flooding included the Farrington Highway in Nanakuli and the Nimitz Highway in Honolulu between River Street and the hairpin turn. **Kauai County** 0645HST 1000HST Kekaha to 10 Urban/Sml Stream Fld Koloa Heavy showers produced minor flooding of roads in the Koloa and Poipu areas. Omao received 2.4 inches of rainfall between 6 a.m. and 10 a.m. **Maui County** Puunene 10 1700HST Urban/Sml Stream Fld Runoff from heavy showers closed a portion of Pulehu Road between Omaopio Road and Hansen Road. **Hawaii County** Kailua Kona to Kealakekua 1700HST 1945HST 0 Urban/Sml Stream Fld Street flooding reported at several locations near Kailua Kona and Kealakekua. **Hawaii County** 9 N Pahoa 20 1040HST Waterspout A nearly stationary waterspout was spotted by a pilot just offshore of Kaloli Point on the Puna Coast.
