OUR PHARMACIST STATISTICS

Our pharmacy staff come from a variety of educational backgrounds. Our staff have attended 20 different schools of pharmacy across 14 States and 2 countries. Ten of our pharmacists are Board Certified Pharmacotherapy Specialists. Fifteen of our pharmacists have completed PGY1 residencies, and two of our pharmacists have completed PGY2 training. The diverse educational backgrounds of our pharmacists provide residents with multiple teaching and practice styles. We have pharmacist-run disease state management clinics for anticoagulation, diabetes, hyperlipidemia, hepatitis C and pain management. Pharmacists round with the medical teams in our Surgical Intensive Care Unit, Medical Intensive Care Unit and with the Internal Medicine teams. PVAMC utilizes technology to achieve our pharmacy's mission to promote safe and effective medication use. The VA uses a computerized patient record and order entry system. To assist in prescription filling, PVAMC utilizes the ScriptPro automated prescription filling system. Our dedicated staff and computerized pharmacy resource systems allow us to meet our mission statement and provide excellent patient care.
