PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

he Pharmacy Practice Residency (PGY1) at the Philadelphia VAMC is designed to allow the development of the resident into a competent clinical practitioner who will contribute to positive outcomes in the practice of pharmacy. Approximately half of the rotations are in the inpatient setting, and half of the rotations are in the ambulatory care setting. The program will focus on the development of skills in a variety of practice settings including acute care, ambulatory care, administration, drug information, and research. The resident will achieve development of these skills through participation in rotations including:

- Adult Internal Medicine
- Critical Care (Medical And Surgical)
- Ambulatory Care (Primary Care)
- Anti Coagulation Services
- Geriatrics
- Psychiatry
- Infectious Diseases
- Practice Management/Administration
- Formulary Management
- Research
- Disease State Management
- Pain Management
- Community Living Center
- Oncology

In addition, the resident will also participate in the completion of a formal research project that will be presented at the Eastern States Residency Conference.

The resident will have the opportunity to achieve adjunct faculty status with the University of the Sciences in Philadelphia (USP) through teaching opportunities available at the school throughout the residency year. The residents will be expected to develop their skills as preceptors through interaction with pharmacy students on rotation at the VA.

ABOUT THE PHILADELPHIA VA MEDICAL CENTER

he Philadelphia VA Medical Center (PVAMC) is a 280-bed (acute + nursing home) tertiary care facility that provides comprehensive health care to Veterans in the greater Philadelphia region. In conjunction with our community based outpatient clinics, the PVAMC serves nearly 60,000 Veterans each year. The focus of the organization is on the provision of a comprehensive patient care program. The medical center provides clinical and administrative support to inpatient, ambulatory, and continuing care programs. These services are provided at the medical center as well as at clinics in Fort Dix NJ; Gloucester, NJ; Camden, NJ and Willow Grove, PA.

The PVAMC delivers high quality health care to Veterans in such areas as ambulatory care, urgent care, cardiology, dermatology, endocrinology, gastroenterology, hematology/oncology, infectious diseases, nephrology, neurology, pulmonary medicine, and rheumatology. The PVAMC provides comprehensive mental health services including behavioral medicine, opioid drug dependence, and pain management. The PVAMC is a center for excellence in Parkinson's disease and mental illness research and education (PADRECC, MIRECC).

The PVAMC is also dedicated to teaching and educating future health care professionals. The PVAMC is affiliated with the University of Pennsylvania schools of medicine and dentistry. The PVAMC is affiliated with the pharmacy programs at the University of the Sciences in Philadelphia and Temple University, and it serves as a rotation site for final year doctor of pharmacy students from both institutions. The PVAMC has an agreement with the University of the Sciences in Philadelphia to provide didactic education in the laboratory sessions conducted at the school, as well as a teaching certificate.
