Fellowships for Graduate Students

The National Sea Grant College Program, a program within the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) offers two national fellowship opportunities for graduate students with an interest in ocean, coastal and Great Lakes resources:

- The Sea Grant Knauss fellowship matches highly qualified graduate students with “hosts” in the legislative and executive branch of government located in the Washington, D.C. area, for a one year paid fellowship.
- The Sea Grant/NOAA Fisheries Graduate Fellowship Program is offered in two specialized areas: population dynamics and marine resource economics.

SEA GRANT KNAUSS FELLOWSHIP

The National Sea Grant College Program’s Dean John A. Knauss Marine Policy Fellowship, established in 1979, provides a unique educational experience to students who have an interest in ocean, coastal and Great Lakes resources and in the national policy decisions affecting those resources. The program matches highly qualified students enrolled in graduate programs with “hosts” in the legislative and executive branch of government located in the Washington, D.C. area, for a one year paid Fellowship. The program is named in honor of one of Sea Grant’s founders, former National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration’s (NOAA’s) Administrator, John A. Knauss. Each year, the fellowship begins in February and ends the next January.

SEA GRANT/NOAA FISHERIES FELLOWSHIP

In 1999, NOAA’s National Sea Grant Office and NOAA Fisheries established a Graduate Fellowship Program in population dynamics and marine resource economics. The program supports Ph.D. students interested in the population dynamics of living marine resources and the development and implementation of quantitative methods for assessing their status as well as Ph.D. students interested in marine resource economics (concentrating on the conservation and management of living marine resources). Applications are generally due in February for fellowships which begin in the summer.

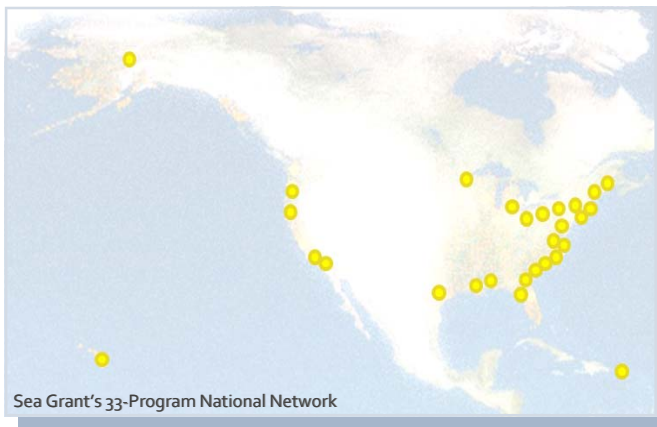
