SUBJECT: Policy Memorandum #01-14, Substance Abuse

1. References.

- a. AR 600-85, Army Substance Abuse Program, RAR 2 December 2009.
- b. AR 600-1, Regulated Activities of Members of the U.S. Forces, Civilian Component, and Family Members, 20 May 2009.
- c. AR 190-5, Motor Vehicle Traffic Supervision, 22 May 2006.
- d. USAREUR Regulation 190-1, Driver and Vehicle Requirements and the Installation Traffic Code for the U.S. Forces in Germany, 4 Feb 2009.
- e. AR 635-200, Active Duty Enlisted Administrative Separations, RAR 27 Apr 2010.

2. Applicability. This Policy applies to all members of the U.S. Forces who are assigned or attached to the U.S. Army Garrison Schweinfurt area of responsibility.

3. Policy.

- a. Any Soldier who is impaired by alcohol or drugs jeopardizes the safety of his fellow Soldiers. Leaders at all levels will identify Soldiers with a substance abuse problem and ensure referral (DA 8003) to the Army Substance Abuse Program (ASAP) for an evaluation. Unit commanders will support the recommendations made by the experts to either enroll the Soldier in treatment or offer the Soldier education.
- b. Alcohol abuse is an irresponsible use of alcohol leading to misconduct, unacceptable social behavior or impairment of an individual's performance of duty, physical or mental health, financial responsibility, or personal relationships. Alcohol abuse is incompatible with the standards and goals of the U.S. Army. Alcohol abuse reduces job performance, jeopardizes combat readiness, and destroys family life.
- c. Drug abuse is the illicit use of any illegal drug or the misuse of prescription medications. In addition, AR 600-85, Para 4-2(1)-(5), also prohibits the use of substances for the purpose of inducing excitement, intoxication, or stupefaction of the central nervous system. This provision includes, but is not limited to designer drugs, inhalants, banned dietary supplements and naturally occurring substances, (i.e., Salvia Divinorum).



4. Procedures. Persons subject to the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) and Manual for Courts-martial, United States, 2005, who violate this policy, are subject to disciplinary action under Article 92, USMJ or the other appropriate adverse administrative actions. Leaders must identify Soldiers with potential substance abuse problems before this abuse affect them, their fellow Soldiers or their families. Identify those Soldiers who abuse drugs and alcohol, help those who we can help and take appropriate action against those we cannot. Soldiers have the right to expect each member of their section to pull their share of the load.
