Buffalo State (BSC) will offer General Education classes during Spring 2013 that will help you earn general education credits transferable to Associate and Bachelor bearing institutes and your CCAF Degree. These classes will be offered on the 914th Reserve and 107th Guard's UTA weekend. They will be given in Hybrid, Online and/or Traditional setting.

FAQ's

1) How will it work?

The classes given by Buffalo State (BSC) will be offered in one of three methods; Hybrid, Online, or in a Traditional Setting. The Hybrid Classes will meet with a professor on Saturday's of the UTA weekend for two hours and forty minutes and the rest of the course work will be completed online through our ANGEL program. The Traditional Classes will meet once a week for two hours and forty minutes during the entire semester. Class meetings will be held on Niagara Falls ARB. Finally, the Online Classes will work much like your CBT's. The course work for these classes will be completed entirely online through our ANGEL program. BSC will run classes during the 914th and 107th's UTA. This will allow you to sign up for more than one course. This is especially important for National Guardsmen because these individuals may have to sign up for 6 credits (Two Classes) in order to use their Tuition Assistance benefit (TA).

<u>IMPORTANT NOTE 1:</u> In order to run any one class Buffalo State must have at least 10 students enrolled in that class. Otherwise, the class will be canceled. Please encourage your colleagues to consider furthering their education.

<u>IMPORTANT NOTE 2:</u> This program does not qualify for cross registration from another college or university. If you have questions on whether this affects you, please contact us.

2) What do I need to do to apply?

Please review the enclosed class schedule, determine what course(s) you would like to sign up for, and complete course registration form. You will mail this form back along with one of the two types of applications, a one page Non-Degree Students or a SUNY Application. If you have taken course(s) with us before, just send us you're the completed course registration and health fee form.

3) How do I know what application to complete?

Complete the **SUNY APPLICATION** if you are:

 Air Force National Guard, Active Duty Navy, Active Duty Army, Army Reserve, Army National Guard, or Army AGR

Complete the **APPLICATION FOR NON-DEGREE STUDENTS** if you are:

 Active Duty Air Force, Air Force Reserve, Air Force AGR, Active Duty Marine Corps, Active Duty Coast Guard or Coast Guard.

<u>Note:</u> If your component is not listed above, please contact your education office. You may not be entitled to Tuition Assistance (TA)

4) What do I do with my completed application?

Once you have completed your application, course registration form and health fee waiver form, mail all documents directly to our office.
