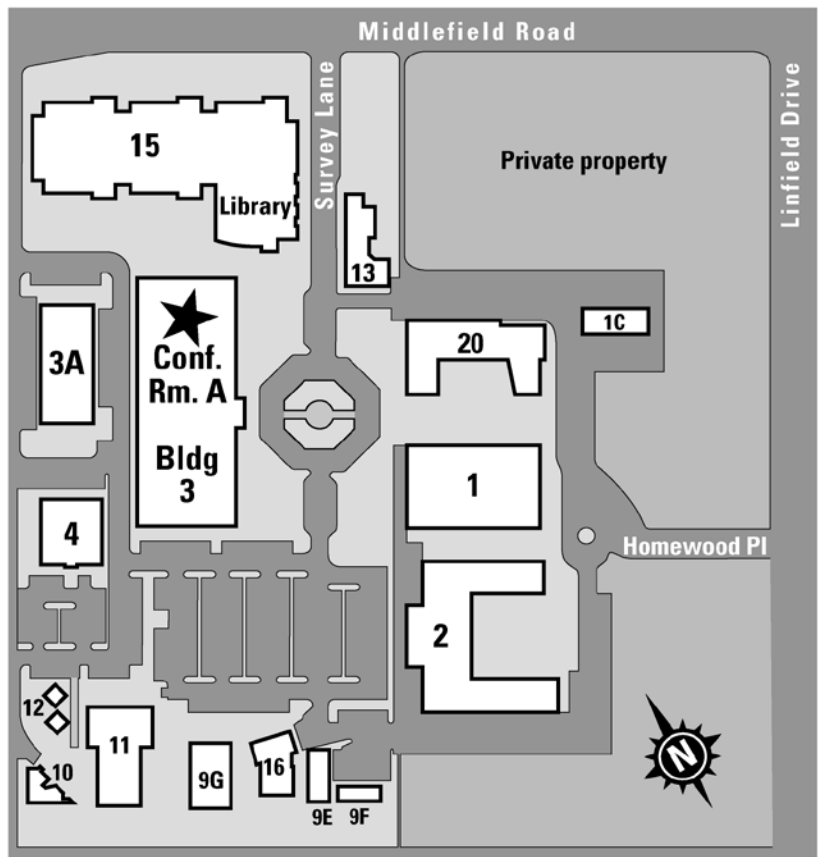
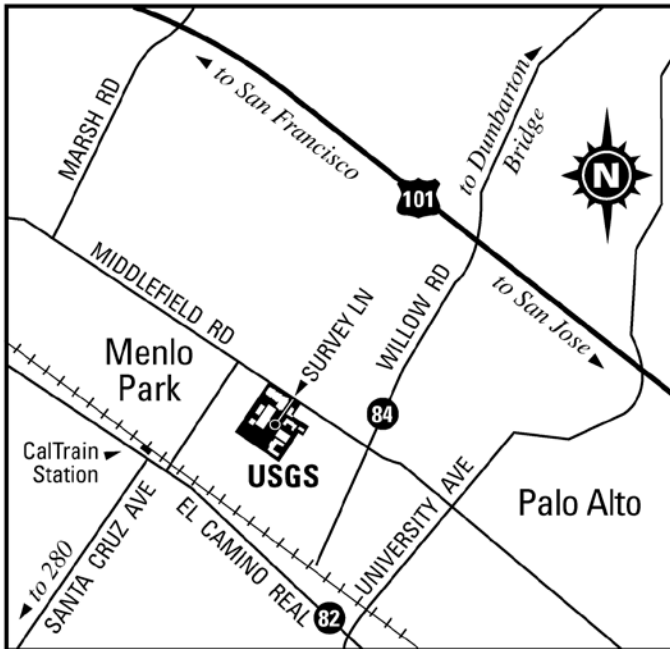

Directions to USGS Menlo Park Service Center

The campus of the USGS Menlo Park Service Center is located at 345 Middlefield Road in Menlo Park. From San Francisco, exit highway 101 at Marsh Road, Atherton and go west to the T junction of Middlefield and turn left (south). From San Jose, exit highway 101 at Willow Road, Menlo Park, and go west to the intersection with Middlefield, turning right (at the Chevron Station). Enter the USGS campus at Survey Land (the main driveway, with large stone markers labeled "U.S. Geological Survey"). You may park in any of our lots and walk to Building 3 (see campus map at right).
