
# THE HEAT IS ON: DESERT TORTOISES & SURVIVAL

INTRODUCED AND DISCUSSED BY TODD ESQUE, ECOLOGIST & KEN NUSSEAR, WILDLIFE BIOLOGIST

- The Mojave Desert tortoise, an important indicator of desert ecosystem health, is being threatened by habitat loss, predators, wildfire, and disease
- Population numbers have severely declined during the last 40 years, raising survival concerns and driving recent recovery efforts
- Can scientists meet the challenge of providing the information required to reverse trends impacting the habitat and wellbeing of the tortoise, and threatening extinction?


#### **From San Francisco**
