Reasons for difference between Baseline Budget and Estimate to Complete:

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Work Completed:

✓ Project Funding: In a Memorandum from the Associate Administrator for Operations dated January 26, 2007, Section 1301 funds for fiscal years 2005 and 2006 were allotted to Federal Lands Highway in the amount of \$23,198,400. In a Memorandum from FLH Director, Office of Program Development dated January 29, 2007 \$23,198,400 was allocated to EFLHD for the Heartland Corridor.

Work-In-Progress:

- Preliminary Engineering: The Railroad signed a contract on September 29, 2006 with Hatch Mott MacDonald to complete the preliminary engineering for the project. A format for plans has been developed and agreed upon, and preliminary design continues. 70% plans for the first tunnel package for VA is scheduled for late March 2007. 70% plans for the first tunnel package in WV is scheduled for late April 2007. Completion of the design for the remaining tunnels will be on hold in order to incorporate some of the lessons learned from these first construction projects.
- Construction Engineering: A Request for Proposals for the construction management of the Heartland Corridor Clearance Improvement Project was requested to be posted on the West Virginia DOT web site on January 23, 2007. A mandatory pre-proposal meeting is scheduled for February 14, 2007 in Bluefield, WV. Proposals are due March 1, 2006.
- Contractor Meeting: A Contractor informational meeting is scheduled for February 13, 2007 in Charleston, WV. This notice was requested to be posted on the WVDOT website on January 23, 2007. The notice was posted on the EFLHD Heartland website on January 25, 2007. This meeting is being held to inform contractors of future construction work for the Clearance Project and solicit any contractor suggestions as to how the work should be packaged so as to efficiently use the funds for the corridor project.
- NEPA Compliance: EFLHD has been coordinating with the SHPO in Virginia and West Virginia and is in the process of preparing the project information package to send to the respective SHPO offices. The project information packages are scheduled for submission the week of January 29.
- Project Funding: The affect of the continuing resolutions for FY 2007 is being discussed with FHWA HQ. The possibility exists that FY 2007 funding will be held at FY 2006 levels which could result in a 5% reduction in 2007 available funding for Section 1301 funds. It is not known at this point if these funds would ever be reallocated back to the project or lost.
