Reasons for difference between Baseline Budget and Estimate to Complete:

4/19/07 - \$1,108,179 was removed on a prorated basis from both the VA and WV federal participating and WV non-participating rows. This amount was for the planning work completed prior to the MOA and is now included in the Misc. amount. This was done to better correspond with Norfolk Southern's project accounts. Estimate to Complete total is \$263,179 higher than the January 2007 baseline due to higher actual costs for planning and higher estimates for the preliminary engineering for the Ohio bridge work.

Work Completed:

- ✓ Project Funding: In a Letter of Authorization from EFLHD dated July 31, 2007, Norfolk Southern was authorized Section 1301 funds in the amount of \$8,408,244 for the Federal share of construction work in West Virginia (Roderfield, Laurel, and Gordon Tunnels) and Section 1702 funds in the amount of \$757,536 for the Federal share of construction work in Virginia (Cowan Tunnel). Total authorized to date for PE, CE, and CN is \$20,550,908 for Section 1301 and \$1,716,300 for Section 1702.
- ✓ Preliminary Engineering: Final plans and specifications were completed by the Railroad and approved by EFLHD on August 30, 2007 for Antler 1&2, Twin Branch 1&2, and Vaughan Tunnels in West Virginia. All of the remaining tunnels have been through 70% distribution. The 95% deliverables were distributed for Welch, Hemphill No. 1 & 2, Glen Alum, and Hatfield Main No. 2 Tunnels on October 5, 2007.
- ✓ Contractor Pre-Qualification: A third Request for Pre-Qualification was posted on the West Virginia DOT web site on August 9, 2007. Contractor qualification statements were due August 29, 2007. A selection panel reviewed the qualification statements on September 4, 2007 and determined that two new contractors were qualified and will be given the opportunity to bid. This brings the total of pre-qualified contractors to 12.
- ✓ Historical Preservation: The Memorandum of Agreement was finalized and the last concurring party signed on August 31, 2007. The MOA was posted to the project website. A contract was signed on July 11, 2007 with TRC Solutions to perform the cultural resource documentation stipulated in the MOA.

Work-In-Progress:

- Project Funding: EFL has requested from Federal Lands Highway Headquarters an allocation for the FY 2008 Section 1301 and1702 funds to be used in West Virginia and Virginia respectively. At this time, HQ has not received an allotment for these funds. These funds can be utilized in FY 2008.
- Preliminary Engineering: 95% plans and specifications for Welch, Hemphill No. 1 & 2, Glen Alum, and Hatfield Main No. 2 Tunnels have been completed and were distributed on October 5, 2007. HMM is continuing to make good progress on the remaining tunnels.
- Tunnel Construction: A contract for the Cowan Tunnel in Virginia was awarded to Johnson Western Gunite Co., Inc. on September 18, 2007. The contract price was \$10,725,896.60. A pre-construction conference was held September 20, 2007 and the first track outages for work began on October 20, 2007.

Bid documents for the first group of tunnels in WV were distributed on June 29, 2007 to the pre-qualified contractors with bids due August 2, 2007. The invitation for bids was cancelled for the WV tunnels since only one bid was received and it was determined to be

unreasonable. The bid documents were repackaged for Roderfield, Laurel, and Gordon Tunnels with the addition of Vaughan Tunnel and were distributed on September 10, 2007 to the pre-qualified contractors with bids due October 17, 2007. The bids are currently being evaluated.

Bid documents for the second group of tunnels in WV (Twin Branch 1 & 2, Antler 1 & 2) will be distribute in early November with a pre-bid meeting scheduled for November 13, 2007.

- Ohio Bridge Construction: Steel modifications have been completed by Railroad forces at N-634.74 and work is now underway at N-653.84. Plans have been completed for the track work and grading required at N-579.83 and the Railroad is close to awarding a contract for this work.
- Historical Preservation: TRC Solutions has completed the field work for the cultural resource documentation. Sample documentation has been submitted to the WV and VA SHPOs and has received preliminary approval. TRC is currently working on the report and the final submittals to the SHPOs.
