









- 50 total pages







#### **Bonding for Construction Contracts**

- Safeguard to ensure performance and payment of subcontractors and material suppliers
- Required on all federal construction contracts valued at \$150,000 or more
- Default value of coverage is100%
- Value can be lowered or waived on a case-by-case basis
- These sureties, among others, actively participate with the Surety Association of America to meet bond requirements on federal contracts in the Middle East: ACE Ltd., Chartis, Chubb, CNA, Liberty, Travelers, Zurich NA

**Contracting Officer's Decision Matrix:** 100% Bonding, No Bonding or Some Bonding?








