Beringia Bridge, Mayans, Inca, prehistoric man, the 5th/6th graders are trying to get their facts straight as the first social studies chapter assessment is heading their way. This has been a week of review and study strategies to help them prepare.

As if that wasn't enough, the class is also preparing for their first Benchmark test in Reading. These are online assessments from Pearson to test for skills, grammar and comprehension. The students have been taking the online selection tests that

go with each story to practice and prepare for the review of the complete unit. Both grades struggled with independent/dependent clauses until we found the right strategy for telling them apart.

Each student with the support of their parents has been preparing, and most are so ready they have asked to take the test early. With this kind of confidence they will meet the challenge next week so we can start studying for the science test!



Get Gunky!

In our unit "What's the matter?" We conducted three experiments called Color Splash, Gunk, and the Exploding Lunch Bag. The children made predictions and then they tested their predictions. In the color splash experiment, we learned that food color is made mostly of water which has fast moving molecules; they are always moving. Since there is no fat in skim milk we were able to see a great deal of movement with the colors blending. In half and half cream/milk, there was much less movement as the fat is dense but there was much grabbing involved. It looked like an explosion of color! We learned that matter changes depending on how it is handled in making our gunk. In our exploding lunch bag, we learned that

states of matter can change depending on what is mixed with it. The students have many questions regarding this unit which will be coming home for research. What a fun time we are having!! We are hoping we will not to blow up our classroom next week with our volcanoes. We finished our fictional stories and now we are continuing writer's workshop. It is amazing the ideas the students have and the progress they are making in their writing. Money has been the focus in math.: changing in pennies for nickels and nickels for dimes. The children are beginning their book shares this week. This is a special time for them to show off reading with expression and it is especially fun to have parents come in and listen.
