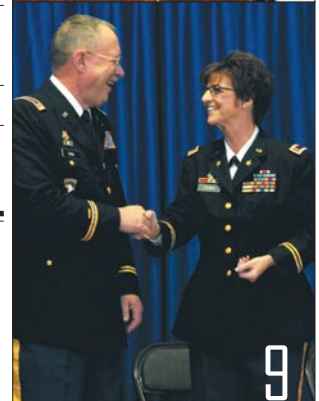

On April 2, 2011, Gov. Dennis Daugaard gave me the great honor of appointing me as the adjutant general of the South Dakota National Guard and Cabinet Secretary for the Department of the Military. I am absolutely committed to continuing to forge the legacy the SDNG has built over the years.

During my change of command address, I cited specific examples of SDNG deployments made during the Mexican Border War, World War I and World War

II. Following World War II, the South Dakota Air National Guard was founded by Medal of Honor recipient Joseph J. Foss on September 20, 1946, in Sioux Falls, with federal recognition of the 75th Fighter Squadron. That same year, the Army Guard reorganized as the 196th Regimental Combat Team, and both the Army Guard and the Air Guard have mobilized time and time again in service to our state and nation.

The world is changing and so too is our operational environment. The SDNG is addressing today's needs and preparing for those we will face in the future. You are all doing a great job of keeping America strong. The SDNG has mobilized and deployed more than twice as many Soldiers and Airmen since September 11 than it did during World War II, and in every deployment we have served with great distinction. Assuming the overall responsibility for the SDNG during time of war is very serious business. In spite of the fact that the U.S. will withdraw from Iraq in the months ahead, we continue to have additional units notified for sourcing, and several more deployments are just around the corner.

My top priority as adjutant general is to take the best possible care of our Soldiers and Airmen and of their families. Readiness has been an

absolute necessity since the National Guard's initial muster in 1636, and it is certainly as important today as it's ever been. But during this period of continual mobilizations and deployments we need to pay especially close attention to the needs of our servicemembers and their families. The quality of men and women serving in our ranks today is at an all-time high. Each and every one of you has volunteered to serve, and thousands of you have at least one combat tour under your belt. We have a duty in this great state to support our Guardsmen and women before, during and after deployments, and we must provide high-quality support for the family members on a continual basis as well.

I have a number of other priorities as well, such as embracing diversity, enhancing the way we communicate internally and externally, and ensuring the viability of the SDNG for generations to come. I also want to identify ways that the Air and Army Guard can work together more closely in the future, and I will host a joint strategic planning conference this summer to set the stage for that.

This truly is our finest hour! Every member of the SDNG should take great pride in the fact that you are serving in uniform during a time of such tremendous reliance on the Guard. I am honored to serve as your adjutant general during these historical times and I look forward to chartering an even brighter future in the days ahead.

Physician assistant deploys in support of Operation New Dawn

RAPID CITY, S.D. - The South Dakota Army National Guard held an activation ceremony March 9 for 1st Lt. Joshua Paull, of Lead, for a six-month deployment in support of Operation New Dawn in Kuwait.

Paull is a member of the 730th Area Support Medical Company, based out of Vermillion, where he serves as a physician assistant for a medical jump squad.

In his civilian career, he works as a physician assistant at Massa Berry Regional Medical Clinic in Sturgis.

"The medical community is doing six-month rotations and is doing a lot of deployments," said Lt. Col. Barry Whitney, 881st battalion commander. "We have the 730th deploying right out of the gate when he gets back, so we're already working with him to deploy with them for 90 days when he gets back."

189th Aviation Regiment receives deployment orders

RAPID CITY, S.D. - The South Dakota Army National Guard's Company C, 1st Battalion, 189th Aviation Regiment (General Support Aviation Battalion), along with three supporting detachments, received official notification for deployment in support of Operation New Dawn in Iraq.

The SDARNG will mobilize approximately 70 Soldiers from the 189th and its three support detachments May 29, 2011.

The 189th GSAB is an aviation unit that provides aero-medical evacuation support with its UH-60 Black Hawks to units within an assigned area of operation.

The 189th is located in Rapid City at the Army Aviation Support Facility (AASF) at Rapid City Regional Airport.

The unit is scheduled to report to Fort Hood, Texas, June 1, to complete all required mobilization training prior to their deployment overseas.

842nd Engineers receive deployment orders

RAPID CITY, S.D. - The South Dakota Army National Guard's 842nd Engineer Company, headquartered out of Spearfish, received official notification for deployment in support of Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan.

The SDARNG will mobilize approximately 160 Soldiers from the 842nd and its two detachments located in Belle Fourche and Sturgis, Sept. 20, 2011.

The 842nd is a horizontal construction unit capable of providing engineer support such as constructing and maintaining roads, developing airfields, constructing force protection measures and providing limited clearing operations.

The unit is split into three communities with the headquarters and support platoon located in Spearfish, Detachment 1 (two equipment platoons) in Belle Fourche and Detachment 2 (maintenance) in Sturgis.

The unit is scheduled to report to Fort Bliss, Texas, Sept. 23, to complete all

required mobilization training prior to their deployment overseas.

S.D. Soldiers recognized nationally in media competition

RAPID CITY, S.D. - South Dakota Army National Guard journalists received national recognition for stories, photos and video projects they entered in the 2010 National Guard Bureau media contest.

The contest has been running for more than 30 years and includes entries from more than 1,000 Citizen-Soldiers and Airmen from 54 states and territories, according to the National Guard Bureau website.

The 196th MEB placed first in the newsletter/field newspapers category, for their newsletter the "KBC Insider" a compilation of stories from the various units at their base in Afghanistan. This entry also moved on to the Maj. Gen. Keith L. Ware competition and placed 2nd overall among active duty Army, Air Force and civilian journalists from the Department of Defense.

The SDNG public affairs office placed second in the magazine-format publication category for "Dakota Pack" a 28-page magazine of the South Dakota National Guard.

Staff Sgt. Shannon Crane, 129th Mobile Public Affairs Detachment, placed third in the television news report category, for "Military firefighting training," a video of servicemembers from Illinois, Massachusetts and South Dakota participating in a real-world firefighting simulation.

Staff Sgt. Theanne Tangen, SDNG public affairs office, received an honorable mention in the photojournalism category for photos titled "Soldiers help restore 'power to the people,'" a compilation of photos of Soldiers assisting utility companies during the 2010 winter storm.

Capt. Anthony Deiss, 196th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade, received an honorable mention in the feature writing category for "Augmenting the War," a story on war contributions made by individual Guardsmen who serve their state and nation by filling key positions in the war fight.

SD National Guard changes command

RAPID CITY, S.D. - South Dakota Army and Air National Guardsmen welcomed their new commander at a change of command ceremony, April 2 at the Rushmore Plaza Civic Center.

Gov. Dennis Daugaard announced his appointment of South Dakota Army National Guard Brig. Gen. Timothy A. Reisch as adjutant general and cabinet secretary of the new Department of the Military.

Reisch will succeed Maj. Gen. Steven R. Doothen as adjutant general. Doothen, who became adjutant general in 2007, intended to retire at the end of former Gov. Mike Rounds' term, but agreed to stay on temporarily at Gov. Daugaard's request.

The adjutant general prepares our National Guard Soldiers and Airmen to go to war and respond to natural disasters at home.

"Tim Reisch is one of the most solid, talented and honest people I have ever met, and there is no one better to lead our National Guard," Gov. Daugaard said.

"Never in our history has the National Guard been more equipped, more competent or more heavily relied upon than they are today," said Reisch. "We've been at war now for more than nine years, and the Soldiers and the Airmen of the South Dakota National Guard have distinguished themselves time after time after time."

Reisch said the stakes are high and admitted that it's a bit of a daunting task to take on these responsibilities during a time of war.

"Tragically, seven of our National Guard Soldiers have been killed since the fighting began. But I know with God's guidance and with the assistance of our many remarkable leaders within our organization, the tremendous legacy of the South Dakota National Guard will continue," Reisch said.

Reisch, who has been Secretary of the State Department of Corrections since 2003, is a 32-year veteran of the SDARNG. He began his military career by enlisting in the National Guard in his hometown of Howard in 1978. He was commissioned as a second lieutenant in 1980, became first lieutenant in 1983, captain in 1985, major in 1992, lieutenant colonel in 1998, colonel in 2002 and brigadier general in 2009.

Reisch, who has master's degrees from the University of South Dakota and the

United States Army War College, is a former commander of the Huron-based 153rd Engineer Battalion and the Rapid City-based 109th Engineer Group.

He was named the first commander of the 109th Regional Support Group in 2007 and was named Assistant Adjutant General-Army in May 2009.

Prior to becoming State Corrections Secretary, he served for 17 years as Miner County Sheriff. He served in the South Dakota Sheriffs' Association, instructed the D.A.R.E. program in Howard, Carthage and Canova elementary school systems, and was nominated the D.A.R.E. Officer of the Year for eastern South Dakota in 1998.

Reisch's father, Amos, served in the SDNG and was mobilized during the Korean War. Both of the new adjutant general's sons - Tim and Trevor - recently returned from a yearlong deployment to Afghanistan with SDARNG's 211th Engineer Company (Sapper).

Reisch thanked his wife, Anne, for the support she has given him throughout their years of marriage.

"I can tell you without question that I would not be here today were it not for her tremendous support," Reisch said.

They have five children: Terra, Tim, Trevor, Tamara and Taylor.

Marlette named assistant adjutant general - Army

RAPID CITY, S.D. - Maj. Gen. Steven R. Doohen officiated the transfer of authority of the South Dakota Army National Guard's assistant adjutant general - Army from Brig. Gen. Timothy A. Reisch to Brig. Gen. Jeffrey P. Marlette, of New Underwood, at the Duke Corning Armory April 2, 2011.

Reisch, the adjutant general select for the South Dakota National Guard, announced his selection for the position March 16, with the concurrence of Gov. Dennis Daugaard.

As the assistant adjutant general - Army, Marlette will be responsible for maintaining the Army Guard as a fully manned, equipped and trained force, capable of deploying in support of state and federal missions at home and abroad.

"I truly look forward to what Gen. Marlette brings to this position," said Reisch, who moved into the adjutant general position and took command of the South Dakota National Guard also on April 2. "He is an extremely competent leader, a strategic thinker and I can't think of a more qualified individual to take over this position."

Maj. Gen. Steven R. Doohen, who became the adjutant general in 2007 told the audience, "I think he's going to be an outstanding replacement for Tim as the Army ATAG (assistant adjutant general). "He's had all of the senior leadership positions in the Army National Guard, he's a War College graduate, a combat veteran; I don't know anybody else as qualified as Jeff is and I just wish him the best in this new role."

Marlette began his military service by enlisting in his hometown unit in Redfield, in 1980. He received his commission through the South Dakota Military Academy Officer Candidate School in 1982. Throughout his career, he has led at all levels, including company command, battalion command and brigade command.

Marlette is a combat veteran, having served as battalion commander of the Second Battalion, 147th Field Artillery in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom II from December 2003 - February 2005. He is currently assigned as the Strategic Plans and Policy officer for the joint staff of the SDNG.

"I am honored and excited for this tremendous opportunity," said Marlette. "It is truly a privilege to be asked to lead at this level in such an outstanding organization. The Soldiers of the South Dakota Army National Guard are among the finest Soldiers in the nation. I look forward to working with General Reisch as he leads the South Dakota National Guard."

In his civilian career, Marlette works for the New Underwood School District, where he serves as the Superintendent of Schools. Marlette holds a bachelor's degree and master's degree in education from Northern State University, an education specialist degree from the University of Sioux Falls and a master's

degree in strategic studies from the United States Army War College.

"Today's South Dakota National Guard is the most trained and capable force we have ever fielded. The demands upon our Soldiers, families, employers and communities to meet the requirements of deployments, ever-increasing Homeland Security missions and continued support to state missions are unparalleled in our organization's history," said Marlette. "In my 31 years in the South Dakota National Guard, I have never been more excited about being a Soldier, more confident of our organization's capabilities or more proud of the men and women who make up our organization."

New Command Chief Warrant Officer is "Crown"ed

RAPID CITY, S.D. - Maj. Gen. Timothy A. Reisch, the adjutant general for the South Dakota National Guard, officiated the transfer of responsibility from CW5 Jerry Duba, who currently serves as the Command Chief Warrant Officer, to CW5 Darla Crown, at the Duke Corning Armory on Camp Rapid April 3, 2011.

Duba is retiring with more than 31 years of military service.

"It's been a wonderful experience for me," said Duba. "I am very honored to have served as the command chief for such a great organization. Darla is going to do great in this position. Her personnel background will serve the warrant officer corps very well and I have the utmost confidence that she will take things to a new level. I wish her the best of luck."

Crown will become the fifth Command Chief Warrant Officer for the SDARNG, and has the added distinction of becoming the first female appointed to this prestigious position.

"It's a tremendous honor that comes with a great sense of responsibility, pride and humility," said Crown. "For the past 37 years, I've been lucky to work with some of the greatest men and women in uniform. The warrant officers in the South Dakota Army National Guard are highly trained technical experts and are ready to perform their mission."

As the Command Chief Warrant Officer, Crown will serve as the senior warrant officer advisor to the adjutant general of the SDNG. She will serve under the direction of the adjutant general to address warrant officer development and strength management of the Warrant Officer Corps.

"When you truly believe in an organization and its mission, the thought of serving at an executive level is very appealing," said Crown. "It's so easy to say, 'If I was in charge I'd do this or that different.' It's a whole different ballgame when you're actually the one responsible for, and or advising on those issues. I plan to draw on my years of professional military and private sector experience and education to do the best job possible for the men and women of the Guard."

She will be responsible for keeping the adjutant general informed and making recommendations in matters of warrant officer recruiting, morale, welfare, schooling, promotion and retention.

"With my background in counseling and education, I am eager to assist in all aspects of the Command Chief Warrant Officer duties," Crown said. "Particularly, the career counseling and mentorship opportunities I'll have with our warrant officers. I enjoy talking to Soldiers about the benefits and rewards of serving as a Warrant Officer. I want to help them reach their potential while ensuring we are inclusive and supportive of their family members, and remain trained and ready for our missions."

She will also oversee a Warrant Officer Advisory Committee and serve as the spokesperson to advise the adjutant general and the chain of command on Warrant Officer Management.

Darla Crown joined the Army nearly 38 years ago, after graduating from Wall High School in Wall, S.D., in 1973, for educational benefits and the opportunity to travel. After her three-year commitment, she joined the SDARNG while attending college at Black Hills State University in Spearfish, S.D.

"When I was about to join the Army and sign documents to serve for three years, I asked mom and dad, 'What happens if I don't like it?' They told me, 'It will be whatever you make it. It all depends on your attitude.' Those words have inspired me all these years to keep a positive attitude and set my goals high," she said.

That attitude has provided Crown a career filled with important milestones.

She became the first female in the SDARNG promoted to CW5 in 2002, a relatively new rank for top warrant officers.

"I am inspired by the talent, dedication and leadership of our command staff, and that of the warrant officers in South Dakota. I am optimistic and excited about the direction which our South Dakota Army National Guard is moving and I look forward to working in this capacity," said Crown. "With the tremendous support and encouragement from my husband of 35 years, Douglas, my parents, Dean and Donna Belle Talty, and my family and friends, I have the confidence and courage to be successful."



196th MEB

wrap up deployment to Afghanistan

For nearly a year, South Dakota Army National Guard Soldiers of the 196th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade have served to leave an enduring legacy in the heart of Afghanistan - working to develop the security and base infrastructure of U.S. and coalition military installations in the capital of Kabul.

That service was recognized on May 3 as eagerly awaiting family, friends and community supporters gathered at the Elmen Center on the Augustana College campus in Sioux Falls to welcome the unit back home to South Dakota soil.

“When a unit returns like this, with every Soldier back safely, it lifts a huge burden from the families,” said Maj. Gen. Timothy Reisch, adjutant general of the South Dakota National Guard. “I want to personally thank all of the spouses and family members that have gone without the companionship and assistance of these fine Soldiers for the past year. Your personal contribution has not gone unnoticed. I want you to know that this state and our nation are forever in your debt.”

The Elmen Center was a scene of tears, hugs and kisses as the nearly 200 members of the Sioux Falls-based 196th were reunited with their loved ones - rekindling the bonds that were put on hold in June 2010 when the Soldiers departed for Afghanistan.

“You did a great job for our nation and we are very proud of you,” Gov. Dennis Daugaard told the Soldiers prior to their heading home. “We’re thankful the Soldiers of the 196th are home safely. We’re thankful you successfully completed your missions. But most of all, we’re thankful to each one of you, for the kind of person you are and for stepping forward for our country when our country needed you.”

As Task Force Rushmore, the 196th took the reigns as the new Kabul Base Cluster (KBC) Installation Command and provided oversight, guidance and operational support to 11 military installations, and more than 9,000 U.S. and coalition forces stationed throughout the city.

The 196th MEB was also the first SDNG unit to be commanded by a general officer in a theater of war in the organization’s history. Commanded by Brig. Gen. Theodore Johnson, no other SDNG unit in

the state has mobilized with a one-star command at the helm since its origins in 1862.

Like the thousands of SDNG Soldiers that have served before them, the 196th joined the legacy of units who deployed in defense of their country, and quickly settled into their new mission as the Kabul Base Cluster Command. Much like its name, the cluster of bases brought its own unique set of challenges and requirements, varying in size, number of forces, infrastructure development and operational control.

"Many of the bases within the Kabul Base Cluster operated independently and had varying levels of support before we assumed command," said Brig. Gen. Theodore Johnson, 196th commander.

"To set the conditions for future success, these bases needed a single command to be responsible for security, logistical and administrative requirements across the KBC."

Primarily stationed at Camp Phoenix, the unit provided this support on a multitude of levels. From improving security and force protection to new building construction and base master planning, the 196th worked in seven directorate areas – developing plans, training and mobilization requirements, providing emergency services, delivering logistical support, coordinating contracting and resource management, facilitating public works projects, ensuring communications and information management, and providing human resources support.

"Much of the support we provided was centered on providing life, health and safety improvements for the servicemembers on the bases," said Johnson, of Rapid City. "By making upgrades to facilities and building new ones, and looking at the future of follow-on forces for the KBC, we have helped to ensure the infrastructure of these bases will sustain the warfighters for years to come."

During the deployment, members of the 196th prepared and facilitated more than 250 construction projects worth \$38 million, enhancing KBC installations and improving their infrastructure.

Additionally, the 196th provided support in the areas of legal services, medical liaison and oversight, religious or chaplain services and public affairs operations.

The 196th also managed master expansion plans, billeting plans, tracking plans for contracted services, force protection improvement

plans and improved supply procedures and efficiencies, to name a few.

With their mission, the 196th as a National Guard unit brought practical experience in operating cities, counties or other governmental agencies at home, which was an advantage in operating bases that function much in the same way.

With civilian careers in civil engineering, city administration, law enforcement, firefighting, and state and local government, the 196th Soldiers used their experiences to manage the bases.

"The base camps needed services that you find in cities – emergency services such as firefighters, public works for adequate living and working spaces, resource management for new construction and maintenance," said Maj. Jason Kettwig, director of logistics and a city administrator when not deployed.

To set the conditions for success, planning was critical to ensuring synergy among the different directorates and services provided.

"The base camps, as with many municipalities, relied on detailed master plans that provided a road map for ensuring essential services are well thought out, and could handle any expansion or growth improvements," said Kettwig, of Milbank. "Directorates needed to coordinate and prioritize their efforts so they do not hinder the objectives of other departments."

To help provide synergy and support at the myriad of bases, some of the 196th members served at other locations as base support groups (BSG) and camp support groups (CSG). These 196th Soldiers provided support at Camp Eggers, New Kabul Compound, Camp Bala Hissar and Camp Black Horse.



The BSG and CSG Soldiers encompassed skills in many areas, with duties and responsibilities for security and force protection, billeting services and management, logistical coordination for food, fuel and supplies, administration support, and management of service, commodities and construction contracts.

Contracting Officer Representatives, or CORs, at each base provided a critical component of support to the bases – ensuring service or security contracts did not lapse, construction contracts were completed to specifications and identified efficiencies in contracts and services.

“Ensuring the CORs correctly kept visibility on a contract was really critical,” said Sgt. 1st Class Paul Carroll, service contracts manager, of Spearfish. “Making certain there was not a gap in service, or construction projects were completed to standard. This became essential to ensuring continuous service for our service members and that U.S. taxpayer money was not wasted.”

Through the efforts of the 196th Soldiers, the unit saved the U.S. government more than \$197 million by providing more efficient processes for construction projects and consolidation of commodities and service contracts within the KBC.

Together, the various 196th MEB directorates and base and camp support groups were able to successfully execute and complete their mission as an installation management command. The 196th was able to address the many issues that arose during the course of their deployment, and provide the support and services needed to the warfighters in their area of responsibility.

For all their efforts, the 196th received the Meritorious Unit Commendation for their service support of Operating Enduring Freedom.

“From an installation management standpoint, the best thing we can do to help win this war is to support those fighting it,” said Johnson. “If our servicemembers don’t have the proper security, training, equipment and facilities, they can’t be successful. I can’t be more proud of the accomplishments and the service and sacrifices of the 196th Soldiers and their families throughout this deployment.”



Officer Candidates awarded for bravery

Three South Dakota Army National Guardsmen enrolled in Officer Candidate School, an intense leadership training program designed to transform Soldiers into effective leaders, found themselves using all of the skills the program teaches just hours after being released from training in February. Officer Candidates Richard Bauman, Travis Tipton and Paul Giovanetti were on their way home to Pierre when they approached an accident on Interstate 90.

The South Dakota Army National Guard presented the officer candidates with the South Dakota Distinguished Service Award, March 5, at Fort Meade.

The award cited that judgment and training were paramount while responding to the vehicle rollover. Their quick and calm response to a dangerous and hectic situation truly shows that they can work under pressure in adverse conditions. They demonstrated the Army Value of personal courage by facing fear, danger and adversity.

The South Dakota Distinguished Service Award is awarded to Soldiers with an extraordinary achievement that resulted

in an accomplishment so exceptional and outstanding as to clearly set the individual apart from his or her comrades or from other persons in similar circumstances.

“It’s a perfect example of what’s to come for future leaders for the South Dakota Guard,” said Maj. Stephen Sewell, OCS company commander for Bravo Company, 1st Battalion, 196th Regiment. “These guys think on their feet, they’re ready to serve their country as well as their community at a moment’s notice, and they’ll risk their lives and anything they can to help people out.”

A pickup had lost control about seven miles west of Kimball, slid into the median and rolled.

The officer candidates could tell almost immediately that an accident had just occurred when they noticed the pickup in the median.

“The vehicle was upright, but we could tell by the damage done to the roof, that it had been involved in a rollover,” said Bauman, who works as a police officer in Pierre. “We could also tell by the body language of the passengers that this had just happened. They were visibly shaken and frantic. We had already stopped and then noticed an adult female laying face down in the median.”

Each candidate assessed the situation and immediately moved into the role they believed they would be the most beneficial in.

“We all played an important role,” said Tipton, who works full-time as the Unit Administration Sgt. for Headquarters, Headquarters Company 152nd, Combat Sustainment Support Battalion in Pierre. “Bauman was instrumental in using his experience in law enforcement to direct the scene. He immediately called 911 and then started getting the information they would need to best handle the accident.”

Bauman also focused on the victim with the most serious injury, reporting her condition to the 911 dispatcher, rolling her onto her back and stabilizing her neck and back.

One other adult female and three children were also involved in the rollover and the other two officer candidates immediately recognized the need to assist them as well.

“Tipton focused his attention on the three children, applying first-aid to one and doing his best to keep the others calm and keep their minds off of the condition of the victim,” said Giovanetti.

After handing off his first-aid kit from his rucksack to Tipton, Giovanetti, the Tire/Lube Express Manager at Wal-Mart in Pierre, put on a reflective vest from a patrol car and began directing traffic along I-90. The slippery conditions presented additional

danger to those in the median responding to the accident.

“A lot of things were going on, and we just kept trying to process each event as it was happening, making sure that we were attending to whoever we could and help anyway we could,” said Tipton.

The South Dakota Highway Patrol announced later that a 32-year-old female died as a result of the rollover.

“It’s sad. We’re all fathers too,” said Bauman. “Afterwards, it was pretty upsetting emotionally. We thought about the loss that the children would face and how that could have been any one of us, and it could have been our kids experiencing that loss.”

“I keep going through the events and wondering if there was anything else that we could have done, and I honestly don’t think there was,” Giovanetti said. “I can only hope that by stopping, and doing what we did, that it will one day have a positive impact on the children involved. Maybe one day they will look back at this tragedy and remember that Soldiers stopped and did everything they could to help.”

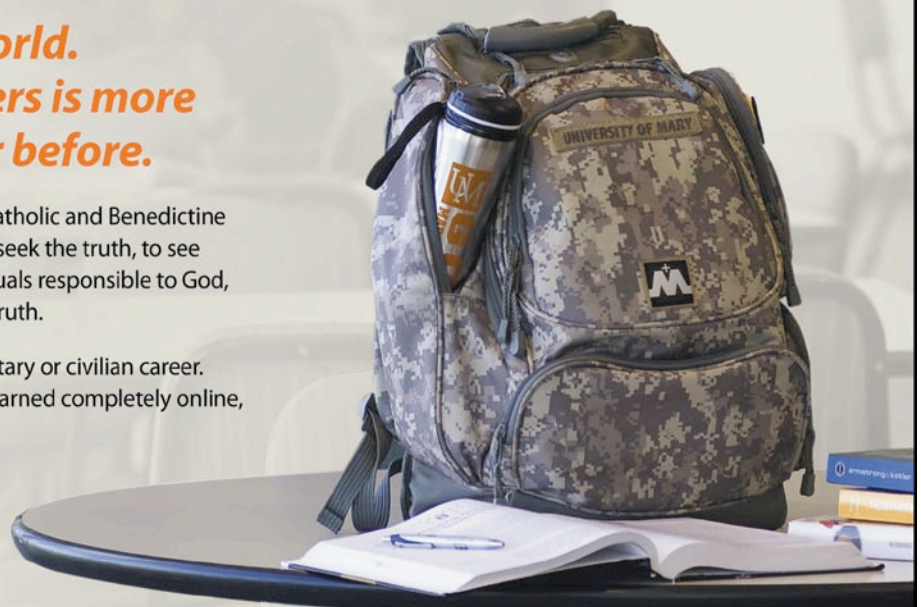

Guard and first responders train together

RAPID CITY, S.D. - A homeless veteran breaks into an abandoned building at 108 East Main Street to take shelter. The man looks for a place to lie down but instead finds a homemade chemical device similar to ones he was trained to identify while serving overseas. Immediately, the man runs to the post office, calls 911, reports what he had found and then flees the scene.

The Rapid City Fire Department's Hazmat Response Team was notified around 7:15 a.m. about the potentially hazardous material. To find out exactly what they were dealing with, they contacted the South Dakota National Guard's 82nd Civil Support Team to assist in testing and identifying the potentially hazardous material.

This scenario was presented at a joint training exercise to the police, fire department and 82nd CST, Feb. 23, in Rapid City. The event was designed to resemble a real-life situation to fine tune the various organizations' abilities in detecting hazardous substances.

The CST, with its 22 full-time Soldiers and Airmen, quickly set up an incident command center on site and worked through their protocols for handling a hazardous material incident.

The Guard unit, based at Ellsworth Air Force Base, can deploy its members within minutes locally and within hours regionally to expedite response time.

Their primary mission is to identify, assess, advise and assist military or civilian authorities for natural and/or man-made disasters with suspected or actual agents or substances at a chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear or high explosive incident.

The CST possesses both Army fielded and commercial off-the-shelf (COTS) equipment to aid in surveying and sampling materials at an

incident, analyzing samples, providing internal medical support and advice, modeling (prediction forecasting) of NBC hazards or potentially affected surrounding areas and incident integration and coordination through a wide range of communication equipment and systems. The CST can provide immediate results of unidentified substances.

The CST participated in the event as part of their monthly training. Usually, the unit plans and executes their training scenario, but this time the Center for National Response (CNR), from West Virginia, planned the exercise.

"Having an outside agency set up the exercise provides us with realistic training," said Lt. Col. Jim Selchert, 82nd CST commander. "Not having the answers to the scenario allows us to approach the situation as if it were real."

Having the opportunity to train with various organizations is beneficial to the servicemembers, said Staff Sgt. Alex Raber, communications noncommissioned officer for the 82nd CST.

"We try to incorporate outside agencies such as first responders and hazmat teams within the state fire departments," said Raber. "It's important to learn their techniques and our strengths and weaknesses in a training environment rather than in a real-life scenario."

The CST also coordinates hazmat training with the fire departments in Aberdeen, Watertown and Sioux Falls.

"We provide hazmat expertise for all federal and state agencies to protect the citizens of South Dakota from hazardous material incidents," Selchert said.

The CST is one of 57 teams across the U.S. and its territories designed to work with state and federal assets.

842nd trains for future success

RAPID CITY, S.D. - Soldiers of the South Dakota Army National Guard's 842nd Engineering Company conducted training in the Black Hills, April 2 in preparation for an upcoming deployment.

"They've been doing exceptionally well," said Sgt. 1st Class Doyle Udager, a platoon sergeant for the engineering company. "All of this training is to gain survivability in a war zone. They've all been taking it to heart, and they take it seriously."

During the 12-month tour overseas, Udager said the unit will be conducting engineering missions, which could potentially include building and repairing roads and constructing barricades for military bases.

The group of engineers will continue to gain valuable training time as they are scheduled to conduct their two-week annual training in Guernsey, Wyo., this summer.

Lieutenant and Warrant Officer of the Year awarded

The South Dakota National Guard presented 1st Lt. Chris Long, of the 196th Regional Training Institute, with the Lt. Col. John J. Steele Award, naming him the South Dakota National Guard's 2011 Lieutenant of the Year.

The Lt. Col. John J. Steele Award was established in 1968 to annually recognize the most outstanding lieutenant in the SDNG. Selection is based on exceptional qualities of leadership, values and performance.

"His dedication to duty and accomplishments over the past year definitely has earned him the distinction to be recognized as the South Dakota National Guard's most outstanding lieutenant," said Lt. Col. Joseph Eining, commander of the 153rd Engineer Battalion.

Long served as a platoon leader with the Madison-based 211th Engineer Company (Sapper) and returned in September from a yearlong deployment to Afghanistan where the unit conducted route clearance patrols of improvised explosive devices (IEDs) along movement and supply routes.

"His platoon conducted approximately 100 route clearance missions and neutralized more than 30 IEDs which directly saved countless coalition lives," said Eining. "He served as a platoon leader conducting some of the most difficult deployment-related missions that are taking place in theater currently."

The deployment was Long's second. In 2004 he spent one year in Iraq with the South Dakota Army National Guard's 2nd Battalion, 147th Field Artillery.

"The opportunity to lead the outstanding NCOs (noncommissioned officers) and Soldiers of 2nd Platoon, 211th Engineer Company this past year in a fairly demanding deployment was a great honor and very rewarding," Long said. "I have been blessed with many opportunities since becoming an officer, but leading South Dakota's finest in demanding combat operations will be hard to top. The Soldiers achieved results above and beyond any previous units conducting similar missions, and that is very rewarding to me as a leader."

Previous to his deployment with the 211th, Long completed Pathfinder, Air Assault and Sapper School, some of the most difficult leadership schools in the military.

"Typically, Reserve Soldiers do not have the time to train mentally and physically for what these courses entail," said Eining. "He rose to the occasion and made sacrifices to put himself in the position to be the first Pathfinder- and Sapper-qualified Soldier in the South Dakota Army National Guard in the past 20 years. Since completing the course, he has become the spark for fellow Soldiers in the company to apply and start training to attend the Sapper course."

Long attributes winning the award to Soldiers past and present who have served alongside him.

“The award is a representation of those that have mentored me and the NCOs and Soldiers of the 211th that have allowed me to be in this position, not so much what I have done as an individual.”

Long currently serves as a platoon trainer for 1/196th Regional Training Institute at Fort Meade where he trains future officers enrolled in Officer Candidate School. He also serves as the training administrator where he plans and executes a national OCS mission along with a coordinating authority for seven OCS companies.

He lives in Sturgis with his wife, Naomi, and his two daughters, Addison, 6, and Avreigh, 3.

“CW2 Maschino is uniquely qualified for this prestigious award,” said Lt. Col. Charles Blasdell, 1st Battalion Commander, 196th Regiment. “He is the senior warrant officer in charge of our Warrant Officer Candidate School responsible for teaching leadership skills and traits to future warrant officers of the South Dakota Army National Guard.”

“I’m very proud to have been recognized by the 196th Regiment and South Dakota Warrant Officers as someone they felt has risen to the top of a very close knit community,” Maschino said.

He has served as a platoon trainer at the Warrant Officer Candidate School (WOCS) at Fort Meade for the last three years targeting leadership attributes and competencies that officers will use throughout their career.

“Seeing these candidates complete their training and being pinned as a newly appointed warrant officer in the United States Army is the most satisfying and rewarding time I’ve had to date as a warrant officer,” said Maschino.

One of Maschino’s highlights from 2010 includes WOCS receiving a “Full Accreditation” rating from the Warrant Officer Career College (WOCC) at Ft. Rucker, Ala., in June. The WOCC oversees all warrant officer educational programs for both Reserve and Active Duty personnel.

In addition to training future warrant officers and officer candidates Maschino serves as the shop supervisor of the Field Maintenance Shop in Sturgis.

“I supervise nine employees that oversee and provide maintenance needs for National Guard units based in the northern Black Hills area,” Maschino said. “We make sure unit equipment is readily available for training and if need be respond to state, national and world crisis.”


He lives in Sturgis with his wife, Kimberly Thome-Maschino, who serves as a major in the South Dakota Army National Guard’s 82nd Civil Support Team as a physician assistant, and his daughter, Madison, 8.
