MAJ Sally Hannan began work as a Project Manager in the Environmental Department of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Honolulu District in January, 2011.

She graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1998 and was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

She was assigned to the 2d Engineer Battalion at Camp LaGuardia, South Korea where she served as a bridge platoon leader and a company executive officer.

After completing the Engineer Officer Advanced Course and earning her Masters Degree in Environmental Engineering from the University of Missouri at Rolla in 2002, MAJ Hannan was assigned to the Staff Engineer Section, 130th Engineer Brigade, Heidelberg, Germany where she served as a plans officer.

MAJ Hannan commanded the Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 2d Signal Brigade in Mannheim Germany followed by command of the 18th Engineer Brigade Rear Detachment during their deployment in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.

Following command, MAJ Hannan spent almost two years serving as the U.S. Army Engineer School, Operations Officer followed by service as the Battalion Executive Officer of the 35th Engineer Battalion at Fort Leonard Wood, MO.
