MEMORANDUM FOR ALL Soldiers Assigned to the 25<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division

SUBJECT: 25<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division Commanding General's Use or Possession of Intoxicating Substances Policy

1. References:

- b. The Secretary of the Army (SECARMY) issued Army Directive 2012-14 titled *Prohibited Substance (Control Substance Analogues)*, 29 May 2012.
- c. AR 600-85, The Army Substance Abuse Program, 2 December 2009.
- d. AR 600-63, Army Health Promotion, 7 May 2007.
- e. Hawaii Act 29, 19 April 2012.

2. Applicability. This policy applies to all military and DA civilians assigned and attached to the 25ID.

3. Policy. Commanders will enforce the Secretary of the Army's directive prohibiting personnel without proper authorization from using, possessing, manufacturing, selling, distributing, importing into or exporting from the United States, or introducing into any installation, vessel, vehicle, or aircraft used by or under the control of the Army: Any controlled substance analogue or homologue such as "Spice", "Bath Salt" or similar substances containing synthetic cannabis, any THC substitute, any synthetic cannabinoid, or any substitute cathinone for the purpose of inducing excitement, intoxication, or stupefaction of the central nervous system. Commanders will randomly test and conduct health and welfare inspections to deter the use of these prohibited substances.

4. Punitive Provisions. Violations by persons subject to the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) are punishable under Article 92 and or Article 112a, UCMJ, or other applicable provisions. Persons violating these provisions are also subject to adverse administrative action.
