INFORMATION PAPER

SUBJECT: Army Substance Abuse Program (ASAP) Army Consolidated Records Schedule (ACRS) Record Categories, Series Numbers and Naming Conventions

1. Purpose: To provide information and instruction on changes to the Army Records Information Management System (ARIMS) system and ASAP file categories, series numbers and labeling procedures.

2. Facts:

- a. The Army Consolidated Records Schedule (ACRS) has been deployed and replaces the Records Retention Schedule-Army (RRS-A) in ARIMS effective 6 Jan 12. The deployment of the ACRS has changed the record categories, series numbers, and file labeling of ASAP results, records, and statistics.
- b. Enclosure A outlines the ASAP record categories and series numbers from the old RRS-A system and the new record categories and series numbers to be used for ASAP records in the new ACRS system.
- c. ASAPs will create Office Records Lists (ORLs) for FY13 ASAP files in ARIMS. All FY13 ASAP files will be labeled using the ACRS record categories, series numbers and naming conventions. FY12 records and records from previous years will remain labeled with RRS-A record categories, series numbers, and naming conventions. Information on the new ACRS system and instructions to build the files and print labels in ARIMS can be found in the ACSAP ACRS power point located on the ACSAP website at www.acsap.army.mil.
