Benefits of 'Soldier ASAP' Participation

- Can be promoted while receiving treatment
- Can re-enlist while receiving treatment
- Can participate and complete treatment without commander notification
- Treatment is available after duty hours
- You can choose to receive services <u>BEFORE</u> you have an alcohol-related incident

Eligibility

- Alcohol issues only, no drug referrals
- Soldiers who have not had an alcohol related incident

NOTE: Certain conditions make Soldiers ineligible for this program. Eligibility criteria will need to be discussed with an ASAP Counselor prior to enrollment.

'SOLDIER ASAP'

<u>Purpose</u>

To increase Soldier self-referrals to the ASAP and promote earlier identification of Soldiers with alcohol problems

<u>Goals</u>

- Assess whether additional confidentiality procedures increase Soldier request for assistance with alcohol use issues
- Reduce stigma of asking for assistance for alcohol related concerns through evening and weekend hour services;
- Enhance Soldier alcohol-abuse rehabilitation efforts.
