
APPENDIX B: AGENCY AND PUBLIC CORRESPONDENCE

Environmental Assessment for the Construction of a New Entrance Road to the Shady Lake Recreation Area

Ouachita National Forest Polk and Howard Counties, Arkansas

The Federal Highway Administration, in cooperation with the USDA Forest Service, proposes to construct a new entrance road to the Shady Lake Recreation Area. The existing Shady Lake Recreation Area entrance road (Caddo Road/FS Road 38) was constructed by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the 1930's. Caddo Road is accessed from State Highway 246, and travels through several private properties before entering Forest Service land. Seasonal high use of the Recreation Area and the associated higher volume of traffic through this residential area cause a potential for conflicts with property owners. The proposed project is consistent with the Ouachita National Forest's desired conditions for a "transportation system of roads and trails [that] is safe, affordable, and environmentally sound, responds to public needs, and is efficient to manage" and recreational facilities that "are high quality, well maintained, safe, accessible, and consistent with visitors' expectations" as stated in the Revised Forest Plan dated September 2005.

The new entrance road would follow an existing gravel service road for approximately 1.2 miles. The entrance road would then follow new alignment for approximately 0.4 miles, and would tie into Caddo Road approximately 0.7 miles south of the Shady Lake Recreation Area. The new paved road would have two ten-foot lanes and two foot shoulders. The new roadway would meet the design criteria stated in the Revised Forest Plan.




The National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) is a procedural law that provides a process for agencies to make an analytical study of the impacts of a proposed action. The initial step in the NEPA process is data gathering and issue identification. This step includes public scoping to gather input from the public on the proposed action and its potential impacts. We are currently at this step in the process. You are invited to comment on the proposed project and its potential impacts, and any issues that you feel should be considered. To ensure that your comments are included in the process, all comments must be submitted or postmarked by **April 7, 2009**.

The next step in the NEPA process is the development of an Environmental Assessment (EA). The EA will include discussion of the proposed project's potential for social, economic, and/or environmental impacts. Once completed, the EA will be released for a 30-day public comment period.

I have had the opportunity to review the MOA and stipulations within the MOA and have a few comments (and questions) related to it.

As you are aware, Polk and Howard Counties are important areas of the Caddo homelands. On page two, of the MOA, lines 66, 67, and 68 it is stated that "a Data Recovery Plan for the recovery of information by means of historic documentation/recordation and archeological excavation will be developed in consultation with the parties of this agreement" yet, we received a Data Recovery Plan from January 2010 (revised March 2010) within the packet of our mail from you stamped "March 22"

I have not had time to review the Data Recovery Plan and don't think that we can do so while also reviewing the MOA in the time given. I say this to ask that you allow us more time to review the Data Recovery Plan and make comments concerning points of interest to the Caddo within the plan. Is this feasible?

Pg. 3, lines 101 &102 "Construction Monitoring" why can't a representative of the Caddo Nation be involved in the monitoring? The Caddo have a unique expertise when it comes to historic properties of religious and cultural significance.

Ibid, lines, 136, and 139, 140. Why aren't the THPOs part of this consultation since it is dealing with "archeological properties?"

Pg. 4, lines 166-171, Is the contractor aware of what Caddo graves may look like? There are certain types of funerary objects that may be left in graves that are also indicative of burials when there may not be any human remains encountered. Will we be consulted in the case where there are no human remains left in the burial?

Pg. 6, line 262, Any agreements will be signed by our Chairwoman, Brenda Sheymayme Edwards.

Again, thank you for the opportunity to comment, and I hope that I will be given enough time to review the Data Recovery Plan. I will be out of the office most of the week next week and doubt I will be able to review it during this time. Is it possible to get an extra two weeks to review the DRP?

Thank you for your response to our comments of June 1, 2010. We find the revised Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) and Archaeological Data Recovery Plan to be acceptable. We agree that a 20% sample will constitute adequate mitigation of the adverse effect imposed by this undertaking. However, we question the need for an on-site conference after the recovery of a 10% sample. While small samples are adequate for a purely descriptive report, it is our experience that problem oriented research normally requires large amounts of data.

My staff has reviewed the referenced cultural resources survey report. It is thorough, comprehensive, and well written. Based on this information, we have determined that archeological sites 3PL342, 3PL355, and 3PL576 are eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places, while site 3PL1322 is ineligible. Therefore, the three eligible sites should be avoided and protected or mitigated by archeological data recovery. No further work or protection is needed for site 3PL1322.

The Fish and Wildlife Service has reviewed your letter dated August 6, 2008 concerning the proposed relocation of Shady Lake Recreational Area entrance road in the Ouachita National Forest, Polk and Howard Counties, Arkansas. Our comments are submitted in accordance with the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act (FWCA; 16 U.S.C. 661-667e) and the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (87 Stat. 884, as amended 16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.).

Endangered or threatened species found within Polk and Howard Counties include Arkansas fatmucket (Lampsilis powellii), scaleshell (Leptodea leptodon), leopard darter (Percina pantherina), Red-cockaded woodpecker (Picoides borealis), and harperella (Ptilliumnium nodosum). The Service recommends that the relocation to the recreational area follow the existing gravel road as much as possible (Alternative 1), and that best management practices to control sediment be implemented. The use of the right-of-way on the existing gravel road would reduce the amount of habitat that would need to be disturbed.

The Red-cockaded Woodpecker (RCW) is known to occur in Polk County. This federally listed species is associated with old growth pine forests. Therefore, if mature pines (over 30 years old) are scheduled for removal as part of this project, the area will need to be checked for RCW and their nesting cavities prior to any land clearing. Should a RCW be located in the project area, the Arkansas Field Office will need to be contacted.

We appreciate the opportunity to provide these comments.

This letter provides U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) comments concerning the above referenced project and is in response to your letter dated February 12, 2010. Our comments are submitted in accordance with the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act (16 U.S.C. 661-667e) and the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (87 stat. 884, as amended; 16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.).

The BA describes a proposed Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) project that would provide additional access to Shady Lake Recreation Area in the Ouachita National Forest. The project consists of widening the existing Rocky Hunting Club Road (gravel) for 1.2 miles and then proposed construction on new alignment for 0.4 mile of road to tie back into County Road 64 after crossing the Saline River just downstream of Shady Lake Dam. In addition to the Saline River crossing on new alignment, one unnamed tributary and South Fork Saline River will also be impacted at existing crossings. The BA does not confirm that the new road surface will remain as gravel or if asphalt or other hard surfacing will be applied. No drainage plan or culvert/bridge plans were available at the time the BA was presented to the Service.

The BA analyses four endangered (E), two threatened (T), and one delisted/monitored species. The FHWA concluded that the project would have "no effect" on the Bald Eagle (*Haliaeetus leucocephalus*; delisted), Red-cockaded Woodpecker (*Picoides borealis*; E) or harperella (*Ptillimnium nodosum*; E). A determination of "may affect, not likely to adversely affect" was concluded for scaleshell mussel (*Leptodea leptodon*; E), Arkansas fatmucket (*Lampsilis powelli*; T), and leopard darter (*Percina pantherina*; T). The Florida panther (*Felis concolor coryi*; E) is presumed extirpated. These determinations were based on historical records and recent habitat surveys which led FHWA to conclude that the chance of any of these species occurring in the action area was unlikely. The Service concurs with the aforementioned determinations and agrees that no further consultation for endangered species is required for this project unless new information becomes available prior to completion of the project.

The lack of bridge design and drainage and final surface preparation plans makes it difficult to adequately address potential sedimentation impacts to aquatic resources at this time. The BA states that FHWA stormwater BMPs for construction will be in place during project construction. However, these BMPs are often inadequate to address long term sedimentation effects from unpaved roads to aquatic resources especially on steep gradients such as those present in the project area. If the road surface is to remain as gravel for a significant amount of time, other BMPs (e.g. well placed cross drains, turnouts, broad based dips) should be installed to ensure that sediment is directed into proper vegetated buffers rather than into the streams. Another cost effective alternative to asphalt application is use of a newly developed aggregate known as driving surface aggregate (DSA) which can be mixed at most quarries. DSA is a precise mixture of aggregate sizes that can be applied with a paver and vibratory roller. The material packs like concrete and provides a wearable driving surface that reduces sediment by as much as 93% compared to traditional aggregates. The surface is much less expensive than paving with asphalt or concrete and requires far less maintenance than traditional gravel roads with a much improved driving surface.

Bridge and culvert design should also be carefully considered prior to project construction. The BA states that no bridge piers will be in the main channel of the Saline River but final designs have not been drafted at this time and such designs are often altered due to funding or other issues. Bridges and culverts should be designed in such a way that maintains appropriate aquatic passage. Bottomless culverts are recommended where appropriate and could potentially be a source of mitigation credits depending on concurrence from U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Section IV. (A.) of the BA addresses potential mitigation measures for the proposed project. Neither this nor any other section includes provisions to provide compensatory stream mitigation which will likely be required by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for impacts to regulated streams under section 404 of the Clean Water Act. Further efforts should be made to identify potential restoration projects within the watershed that would compensate for adverse impacts from the proposed project.

Additionally, numerous species of migratory birds protected under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act occur in the area and may be nesting on culverts or other structures to be upgraded or replaced. Visual surveys should be conducted prior to initiation of construction and special consideration given to the times and dates of construction to avoid impacts to these species which typically nest in Arkansas from March to September.
