Registering for the SAT and ACT

(Menwith Hill's School Code is 724310 for both the ACT and SAT.)

- Please note that you must use the codes we provide for both the school and test center, as military base names are "hidden" on the website since they have restrictions on who may test at these centers.
- You MUST print out your admission ticket and take it with you to the test (or give Dr. Gunderson a copy of the ticket beforehand).
- When putting in your address, indicate that it is "within the USA" and use your PSC address.
- When putting in your school code and test center code, indicate that it is "outside the USA".

<u>ACT:</u> NEW= You must send in a photo ID when you register. Students register for the ACT online at <u>www.act.org</u>. Menwith Hill School's testing center code for the ACT is <u>870090</u>. The ACT costs \$50.50 if your take the ACT Plus Writing, or \$35 if you do not take the Writing. Students who attend DoDEA schools outside the USA do not have to pay the \$27.00 overseas surcharge. The surcharge waiver numbers are serialized, so students must get their individual waiver number from the counselor, Dr. Gunderson. Testing is usually from 8:00 a.m. (arrive at 7:45 a.m.) – 11:45 a.m. on Saturdays.

<u>SAT:</u> NEW= Beginning with the May test you must send in a photo ID when you register. Students register for the SAT online at <u>www.collegeboard.com</u>. Menwith Hill School's testing center code for the SAT is <u>57154</u>. The SAT Reasoning Test costs \$50.00. (Students who are interested in taking the SAT Subject test, which focuses on a specific subject, should see Dr. Gunderson.) Testing is usually from 8:00 a.m. (arrive at 7:45 a.m.) – 12:30 p.m. on Saturdays.

Students should get a good night's sleep before test day, and eat a healthy breakfast. They should arrive at Menwith Hill School at 7:45 a.m., and should bring their admission ticket, government-issued ID, two number two pencils, an approved calculator, a watch to keep an eye on the time, and, if they like, snacks to be eaten during breaks.
