Timetable

A two-semester system is used with ½ credit awarded for an 18-week semester. Block A,B schedule with eight 85 minute periods: seven classes and one seminar period.

<u>Class rank</u> is calculated at the semester by using the GPA on a 4.0 scale. Class ranking for graduation will be determined following the second semester of the senior year for students enrolled at the end of the fourth quarter.

DoDEA has assigned <u>weighted point value</u> to each letter mark in Advanced Placement for the purposes of computing individual grade point averages. The weighted grade only applies when the student takes the AP exam. Menwith Hill uses this weighting to determine class rank and for other competitive purposes within the school. The weighting is as follows: A-5, B-4, C-3, D-2, and F-0.

Students are required to have a 2.0 cumulative grade point average to graduate from a DoDDS school.
