# Executing the Maritime Strategy

"Through working together, partnerships like Africa Partnership Station have trained thousands of military personnel to address mutual concerns ensuring a safe maritime environment."

Around the world, the Navy is executing the core capabilities of the Maritime Strategy; examples from May include:

## **Forward Presence**

- The Ronald Reagan Carrier Strike Group (CSG) flew 202 sorties for 928 hours in support of Operation New Dawn, and the Enterprise CSG flew 1,104 sorties for 6,036 hours in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.
- Philippine officials, including President Benigno Aguino, visited USS Carl Vinson (CVN 70) prior to the ship's four-day visit to Manila, Philippines.
- The George H.W. Bush CSG departed for its maiden deployment and participated in joint exercise Saxon Warrior with the Royal Navy off the coast of southern England.
- USS McCampbell (DDG 85) participated in the International Maritime Defense Exhibition Asia 2011 in
- Naval Mobile Construction Battalion (NMCB) 3 and NMCB 26 constructed security barriers and guard towers in Afghanistan.

# **Power Projection**

- USS Michigan (SSGN 727) and USS Ohio (SSGN 726) operated in the U.S. 7th Fleet area of operations.
- USS Bunker Hill (CG 52), along with international forces, boarded a suspected pirate vessel in the Arabian Sea.

#### **Maritime Security**

- USS Rentz (FFG 38) deployed to conduct maritime security and counter drug operations in the U.S. Southern Command area of responsibility.
- USS Guardian (MCM 5) arrived in <u>Surabaya</u>, <u>Indonesia</u>, for a minesweeping exercise with the Indonesian navy.
- Riverine Group 1 hosted 30 officers from Africa Partnership Station to discuss and observe riverine tactics.

## Humanitarian Assistance / Disaster Response

- USNS Comfort (T-AH 20) arrived in Manta, Ecuador, as part of Continuing Promise 2011. Comfort's team has treated more than 9,090 patients and conducted more than 225 surgeries in the ship's operating rooms.
- Civil service mariners aboard USNS John Ericsson (T-AO 194) rescued five people near the Solomon Islands.

#### **Building Maritime Partnerships**

- USS Cleveland (LPD 7), the flagship for Pacific Partnership 2011, anchored off the coast of Lae, Papua New Guinea, to conduct medical and dental examinations at Haus Clare Crisis Centre for Children and make repairs to a local school.
- Sailors from USS Tortuga (LSD 46), USS Howard (DDG 83) and USS Reuben James (FFG 57) kicked off the 17th annual Cooperation Afloat Readiness and Training in Jakarta, Indonesia.
- Thirteen countries from Africa and Europe participated in Phoenix Express 2011 in Souda Bay, Greece.
- Five Navy divers and three support crew members attached to Commander, Task Group 56.1 participated in a joint diving engagement between Iraqi and U.S. Navy divers to raise a sunken pier in Umm Qasr, Iraqi.
