



Executing the Maritime Strategy

Around the world, the Navy is executing the core capabilities of the Maritime Strategy; operations from July include:

Forward Presence

- <u>USS Enterprise (CVN 65)</u> and Carrier Air Wing (CVW) 1 <u>flew 1,522 sorties, totaling 5,004 hours</u> in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, counterpiracy and theater security cooperation efforts in the U.S. 5th Fleet area of operations (AOO).
- <u>USNS Kaiser (T-AO 187)</u> delivered <u>900,000 gallons of a 50-50 blend of advanced biofuels and traditional petroleum-based fuel</u> to the Nimitz Carrier Stike Group (CSG) for the Great Green Fleet demonstration during Rim of the Pacific exercise.

Maritime Security

- USS McFaul (DDG 74) supported maritime security operations and theater security cooperation efforts in the U.S. Naval Forces Africa AOO.
- <u>USS Underwood (FFG 36)</u> resupplied in Naval Station Guantanamo Bay and embarked a U.S. Coast Guard law enforcement detachment in preparation for <u>Operation Martillo</u>.

Deterrence

- <u>USS Buffalo (SSN 715)</u> arrived at Changi Naval Base, Singapore, as part of Cooperation Afloat Readiness and Training Singapore 2012.
- Navy divers assigned to Mobile Diving and Salvage Unit (MDSU) 2, Company 2-5, installed a hull-trunk sensor for the mine countermeasure sonar aboard USS Sentry (MCM 3) while operating in the U.S. 5th Fleet AOO.

Power Projection

- The U.S. Navy's first afloat forward staging base-interim, <u>USS Ponce (AFSB-I)</u>, <u>arrived in Bahrain</u> to support maritime security operations in U.S. Central Command AOO.
- The Eisenhower CSG concluded port visits supporting maritime security operations and theater security cooperation efforts in the U.S. 6th Fleet AOO.

Building Maritime Partnerships

- <u>USNS Grasp (T-ARS 51)</u> supported joint training with U.S. Navy divers and the <u>Ukrainian</u> Navy during Exercise Sea Breeze 2012.
- High Speed Vessel (HSV 2) Swift completed its participation in Africa Partnership Station East 2012 and departed Rota, Spain to support <u>Africa Partnership Station West 2012</u>.

Humanitarian Assistance / Disaster Response

- Seabees assigned to Naval Mobile Construction Battalion (NMCB) 23 worked with Peruvian soldiers to build a <u>new medical clinic</u> in Independencia, Peru, as part of New Horizons 2012.
- <u>USNS Mercy (T-AH 19)</u> arrived in <u>Cambodia</u> to begin the final mission phase of <u>Pacific Partnership 2012</u>.
